Auxiliary Range Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

Purpose

- Provide a safe place to shoot at longer ranges.
- Provide a rifle range during Wednesday or Thursday trap shooting
- Act as an auxiliary range to the 100 yard rifle range
- Sanctioned high power shooting events

CONTACTS

- club officers listed at gate and club house door.

SAFETY/RULES

- No shooting closer than 100 yards on steel targets and shoot at steel head on to prevent ricochets.
- No use of ammunition that damages steel targets.
- Must use steel targets or paper targets on back board, and no glass or plastic targets.
- You bring it, you take it with you (targets/trash/etc).
- If 100 yard range bench being used, and regular 100 yard rifle range open, may ask people to move to regular 100 yard range if wanting to shoot 200 yards or further.
- No shooting past 500 yards on the auxiliary range, if regular 100 yard range in use.
- First come, first served, in regards to what yardage being shot at on the auxiliary range. If shooters show up at the regular 100 yard range after the 600 yard auxiliary range is in use, shooters on the 600 yard line **MUST** move up to the 500 yard line (or shorter).
- All shooters must shoot from same yardage.
- No reserving range unless approved through club meeting and sanctioned event.
- Must shoot to left side of range where targets are set up.
- Must listen to, and abide by on-site club officers, club designated member or club designated range safety officer (RSO).
- When safety allows, all spent shell casings must be picked up.
- No full auto or simulated full auto fire
- No shooting past 300 yard line if trap shooting line is active
- <u>NO 50 BMG</u>

REQUIREMENTS FOR SHOOTING PAST 300 YARDS

- Must have permission from a designated club member or RSO, in form of a written signature on rule acknowledgment/registration form.
- Must submit a bullet drop table for specific caliber/bullet/rifle being used, in order to get permission. This requirement is only for initial approval and one rifle/load.
- Must sign an acknowledgement of having read the rules, and provide contact information before getting permission to use range. The contact information needs to include name, phone, e-mail and address.

The gate at entrance to the auxiliary range should be lowered when the range is in use. This alerts new arrivals someone is on the range.

USE OF THE RANGE IS A PRIVLEDGE. VIOLATION OF THE RULES COULD RESULT IN THE LOSS OF THE USE OF THE RANGE, OR LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP

MAINTENANCE

- Grass cutting, brush removal
- Rock removal from berm
- Targets, Steel and backboards
- Benches, for serviceability and stinging insects
- Roads
- Trash
