He uses hand dyed fabrics and his own method for applique and trapunto. His Tiffany Style Quilt, Wisteria, hangs at the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky.

- Saturday, 12 Oct. 9-4 pm Stained Glass \$25 + Kit fee \$40

- **MONTHLY MINI**: Amy Mazich and Kathy DeCarlo displayed the monthly minis: 1. Anonymous donation of Blueberry Fat Quarters and a Fat Quarter book. These were won by Bonnie Dodson. 2. Cathy Fowler donated a Placemat and Lois Bates donated a Pin Cushion, won by Virginia White. Donations for the Monthly Mini can be given to Amy or Kathy.
- 2019 RAFFLE QUILT: Tickets are still being sold for the 2019 Raffle Quilt. Cost is \$2 a ticket or 6 tickets for \$10. Drawing for the Quilt will be in November.
