NOTES FROM FR. VANDEWALLE

The Last 4 things – These are death, judgement, heaven, and hell. Especially in November and the beginning of Advent, our Faith allows us to look at these realities with Jesus beside us and prepare for them that we may receive the life that makes the sufferings of this life “as nothing” according to St. Paul.

Proper awareness of the three voices (God, ourselves, evil spirits). According to St. Ignatius, for the person who is living a life of sin, the evil one encourages them to continue doing what they are doing, makes it attractive, tries to make things smooth in that regard, whereas God tries to shake the person up (for their own good) to see their danger. For the person who is striving to live virtuously, the evil one “bites, saddens, disquiets with false reasons, puts obstacles”. Some of those sadnesses or obstacles might be accusations of “you’re not good enough,” “you’re no good nor lovable,” “why do you even try,” “you’re a mess up.” In Faith, we REJECT THOSE FALSE MESSAGES. Remind yourself of the truth - that you are son or daughter, valued by God and you WILL choose to do Good, not be discouraged, and if you’ve failed, WILL quickly receive mercy and get up again and go back to goodness and loving along WITH God.

Cloistered Sisters Collection – The Envelope for the Cloistered sisters is taken up at Thanksgiving (or the weekend surrounding it if you can’t make Thanksgiving Day mass, which is a great thing to do to return thanks on that day). The cloistered sisters of our diocese that live in a cloister/monastery never leave there except for exceptional occasions or medical appointments. They work, pray and sacrifice. Though it is a difficult life, you will find that they are among the happiest people on the earth if you have the opportunity to meet them. Their powerhouse prayers, interceding for the world before the Lord in prayer, help to hold up the world and will be amazing as we witness what they’ve done at the final judgement at the end of time and for eternity.

The Gift of Counsel – As we prepare for Confirmation (Monday, March 9th at 7:00pm in Weston) in our parishes this year, I’m appreciating the Gift of Counsel – on of the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Counsel is the Spiritual insight to know the right things to do in particular situations. There are so many factors that go into making decisions, especially considering how different people think, one from another. Sometimes the right thing to do is clear, especially those things which Jesus teaches through his church, but other times it is difficult. But we can recognize that we have an advocate and helper in the Holy Spirit and ask that he works through us His amazing gift of Counselor. “I will send the Holy Spirit to Guide you in all things,” Jesus told his disciples.
