

Many of you might have thought that I was going to start going on and on about money because often when we hear the word "stewardship" it is associated with the amount of money an individual will tithe to God or give to a church as their offering. But while stewardship - especially Christian stewardship includes financial generosity, it is about so much more than just money. According to MerriamWebster.com the definition of stewardship is:

1 : the office, duties, and obligations of a steward

Merriam Webster gives us the secular definition but what about stewardship as a Christian? As a follower of Christ, stewardship is everything you do after you say "yes" to Jesus. It is a lifestyle choice that recognizes everything is a gift from God. When a Christian says. "I believe", it is the first step along the path of Christian stewardship in a life characterized by service, generosity, participation, worship and thankfulness. A Christian steward contributes his or her time, talents, prayers and financial resources with a willing and joyful spirit. Being a generous giver (of all the gifts we have been given by God) is a spiritual response to God's goodness. True Christian stewardship is a spiritual discipline - not humanity's way of raising money but God's way of raising disciples. Jesus taught that God is the provider of all that we possess and that our call is to be generous givers of the resources that God has entrusted to us. As I think about stewardship and the incredible gifts that God has entrusted to the people of St. John's, I get excited! This excitement comes as my imagination takes over with the endless possibilities of how God wants to use us to raise up and equip disciples. Can you even begin to imagine the hearts and lives that can be changed if we lived every day of our lives committed to joyful and generous Christian stewardship? Just think of all the disciples that God can raise up when we intentionally serve him with the gifts and resources that have been given to us. Don't you wonder what the world would look like if each one of us used God's gifts to glorify God instead of self? Stewardship...what does it really mean? It means that we are held accountable for the gifts/talents that we have been given and the gifts/talents that we share with one another. With each passing day we are being called by God to be more intentional about our stewardship - to give more of the time, talents, gifts, and resources that have been entrusted to us so that God can be glorified.

So now that we know what it is...what do we do? We begin by nurturing generous living in our lives, our families, and throughout the church. And we do this because "generous living is not just about giving money, or even just about giving. It is about who we are, whose we are, and how we care for our neighbors.

Christian stewards are caretakers and caregivers. They concern themselves with the distribution of gifts and resources so that all might benefit (Genesis 2:4-9; Matthew 14:13-21, 25:31-46; 1 Corinthians 12:12-28; James 2:14-17).

A Christian steward is CONTENT

Christian stewards acknowledge that their strength comes from God through whom they can do all things regardless of how many or how few material possessions they have (Philippians 4:11-13; 1Timothy 6:6-10).

A Christian steward is GENEROUS

Christian stewards give whatever is needed and whenever it is needed (Proverbs 11:24-29; Mark 10:17-22; Luke 12:13-21; 2 Corinthians 8:1-15; 2 Corinthians 9:6-15; Galatians 5:22-23; 1 Timothy 6:17-19).

A Christian steward is GRATEFUL

Christian stewards value what has been entrusted to their care and protect and preserve everything as if it were their own, yet acknowledging that the earth and all that is in it belong to God (Psalm 24; Psalm 92:1-4; Luke 16:19-31; Philippians 4:6).

A Christian steward is LOVING

Christian stewards know that the Lord requires justice and kindness and humility, and they follow the two greatest commandments (Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Micah 6:6-8; Mark 12:28-34; Luke 10:29-37; Luke 11:42; 1 Corinthians 13:3; 1 Corinthians 16:13-14; 2 Timothy 1:7; 1 Peter 4:8-11).

A Christian steward is LOYAL

Christian stewards serve God faithfully, remembering who they are, whose they are, and why they are here on earth (Matthew 6:19-21, 24; Luke 14:25-33).

A Christian steward is OBEDIENT

Christian stewards obey God by setting aside a part of all their income for others (Deuteronomy 14:22-29; Deuteronomy 26:1-18; Malachi 3:6-18; Luke 18:18-30; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2).

A Christian steward is PRAYERFUL

Christian stewards acknowledge the greatness and goodness of God through prayer, fellowship, study, worship, and reflection (Isaiah 40:28-31; Psalm 145; Jeremiah 29:11-14; John 6:25-40; Romans 12:1-21).

A Christian steward is **RESPONSIBLE**

Christian stewards realize that caring for God's creation and wisely managing resources never ends (Genesis 41:37-45; Numbers 18:25-32; 2 Samuel 24:18-25; Matthew 28:16-20).

A Christian steward SACRIFICES

Christian stewards follow Jesus' teaching to sacrifice what they have out of gratitude for their many blessings (Mark 12:41-44).

A Christian steward SHARES

Christian stewards have learned to distribute fairly so that none will be in need (Luke 19:1-10; Acts 4:32-35; Acts 20:34-35).

A Christian steward is <u>TRUSTWORTHY</u>

Christian stewards can be trusted to make wise decisions concerning the resources placed within their care (Matthew 25:14-30; Luke 16:10-13; 1 Corinthians 4:1-2).

2020 General Conference

Every four years, United Methodists from around the world assemble and connect in worship, prayer, Communion, fellowship — and the legislative work that shapes our shared life. As these United Methodist laity and clergy gather together, they set the rules and establishes procedures for virtually every aspect of the church's life. Their time together is also spent discerning and communicating the denomination's official position on a variety of issues and cultural challenges.

The 2020 General Conference of The United Methodist Church will convene May 5-15 at the Minneapolis Convention Center in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

It is important for us to be in prayer for all those who will attend General Conference 2020 (GC 2020), **all** of the decisions that will be made during their time together, the conversations that will be shared, and the outcomes of their decisions that will chart the course for the future of the United Methodist Church.

The United Methodist Women released an article about praying when preparations were being made for the special session of the General Conference last year, but their weekly prayer prompts are timeless; therefore, they remain relevant. St. John's, let us join together in prayer!

Sunday: Pray for The United Methodist Church, for its lay members, clergy members, fellowship, discipleship and leadership work. Pray that we would ground our feet firmly in hope. Pray also for the future work of the church.

Monday: Pray for the delegates. The responsibility they carry can feel heavy, and the emotions they are feeling and receiving can take a toll. Pray for their resilience and openness to the Holy Spirit, who speaks even when we are in "self-protection mode" but to whom are most receptive when our hearts are open, and we are hope-filled.

Tuesday: Pray for all who will be presiding and leading during the Conference and for the staff who will be serving. Their clarity and wisdom make a big difference in the kind of conversation that the delegates are able to have and whether the delegates have confidence in the processes surrounding their work.

Wednesday: Pray for the outreach and mission service of The United Methodist Church and how this will be enhanced by the structures and directions set by General Conference. Pray for the ministry of congregations, conferences and agencies serving people in need around the world. The Prayer Calendar is a great resource to be reminded of some of these.

Thursday: Pray for the education ministry of the church and the ways that this equips us to engage in a future full of possibilities. Pray for the students and faculty that we support through scholarships, student ministries and publishing. Pray for the tutoring work of congregations and national mission institutions, for secondary schools, colleges, universities and seminaries who are also dealing with uncertainty about how they will connect with the church in the future.

Friday: Pray for all the justice ministries of the church and for how these will be strengthened by the work of the special session. Pray for the work to address policies that marginalize and patterns that demean. Pray for our relationships with ecumenical partners and persons engaged locally, regionally, nationally and globally in God's love and the vision of justice we are called to lift up. Pray for a commitment to hope that shapes our engagement with a fractured but beautiful world.

Saturday: Pray for all of us across the church who are charged with the stewardship of the resources entrusted to us and how our hope, rooted in faith, shapes our use of these resources of time, commitment, effort and finances so that we might give neither too much nor too little regard to the potential of these gifts and our responsibility to use them well.

From the St. John's United Methodist Church Trustees:

The trustees have been involved recently in several projects consistent with the developed Five Year Plan.

The cemetery has been getting a spring cleaning with additional landscaping improvements underway. In addition, several dead trees may need to be removed.

The metal building improvement project is nearing completion. An awning was ordered for the entrance door adjacent to the main office entrance. Several Sunday School classes worked together in selecting the awning style and color. The awning should be installed by March 15. After the awning is installed the door / door frame will be repainted to blend the colors of the building and entrance.

Lighting improvements in the parking lot are a high priority. Duke Energy was on site recently and agreed to improve existing assets along with adding additional lighting assets. These improvements will hopefully be completed by March 15. This project will significantly improve campus safety and security.

A final quote for the Phase I: Campus Electronic Security Improvement Project is pending review. This project will include installing surveillance, remote entry, and door security equipment to properly secure the Church office area, Sanctuary, and Education Wing entrance. Additional campus security improvement Phases will be needed in future years. This project is a high priority and will be completed as soon as possible.

In the coming weeks you will notice Church Campus landscaping improvements. Bush sizes adjacent to entrances will be reduced to improve security and safety. In addition, the garden area between the main building and the metal building will get some landscaping and cleanup.
