GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations):

By completing this form you agree to give the Snowdonia Walker permission to hold relevant personal details. The Snowdonia Walker will not share the information with any other parties.

Fees: If Snowdonia Walker cancels your walk a full refund may be given. Cancellation by you up to 14 days before the walk a 50% refund will be given, cancellation with less than 14 days notice before the walk a 50% refund in the form of a credit note will be given, cancellation with less than 4 days notice - no refund or credit note will be given.

All parties must meet at the agreed meeting point for the walk at the agreed time & date.

Guides will only wait up to 20 minutes past the agreed time for group walks and 40 minutes past the agreed time for private bookings, non arrival after this time will deem the walk cancelled by those parties

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Insurance:

All our walk leaders carry public liability insurance, but we recommend that you take out the appropriate personal accident insurance for yourself on the walk/event.

Weather:

All our walks and events take place in the mountains and as such are subject to the weather conditions at the time and may determine our programme for the day, everybody's safety will be our first consideration at all times.

Risk and Emergencies:

We operate in the mountains, on rough, uneven, slippery, wet and loose ground at times, accidents may happen, if they do we will follow our emergency procedures which may mean the walk will be cancelled from that point. All our Mountain Leaders have a minimum of the Rescue Emergency Care Award which is specific to First Aid in remote areas.

We recognise that mountaineering, mountain sports and outdoor activities in general have a risk of personal injury or death. Participants in these activities should be aware of and accept these risks and be responsible for their own actions and involvement.

Any person reading these pages should be responsible for getting the proper instruction in the techniques and equipment necessary for hillwalking, mountaineering or taking part in outdoor activities and assume all responsibility for Injuries incurred to themselves or to third parties.
