Reading and Praying Through the Book of Acts An 8 Week Journey - Three Chapters A Week

We will be starting a Zoom telephone/video conferencing bible study of the Book of Acts, led by Sue Grafstrom. We will connect each Tuesday at 7:00 pm for a 45 minute time period to discuss three chapters from Acts. The following schedule will be the guide for our 45 minute discussion.

10 minutes: Check in time. Relationship building. How's it been with you and/or your family this past week? etc.

25-30 minutes: Conversation about the 3 chapters of the Book of Acts you agreed to read. Questions for reflection and response are:

What is God doing in these three chapters?

What are people doing in these three chapters?

What is the Holy Spirit doing?

What lessons are here for me and our congregation?

5-10 minutes. Pray for

- ...each other
- ...the gift of the Word you've just encountered in each other
- ...your congregation's ministry in a time such as this
- ... your neighbors in the surrounding community
- ...vision of God's mission Jesus is calling your congregation too

Family Devotional

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT - MARCH 29

Watch for a weekly e-mail from Messiah containing these family devotionals from Illustrated Ministry

Describe a recent time you were upset about something and what made you feel better.

Note: If you are with a group, have each person take a turn sharing.

SCRIPTURE READING: PSALM 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, OLord. Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered. I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in God's word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning.

O Israel, hope in the Lord!
For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with God is great power to redeem.
It is God who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.

REFLECTION

This morning's scripture is from the book of Psalms, which is an entire book of songs and prayers written to God. Some of the psalms are really happy, but not all of them. In this song, the psalmist is deeply upset and looking for comfort and hope by crying out to God.

The psalmist cries out to God from the depths - a place of grief, despair, and deep worry. But as we read on, we can hear how the psalmist has faith things won't stay that way. The psalmist trusts God will listen to their cries and bring them up from the depths. It won't be immediate, though. There will be waiting.

Waiting is a hard thing to do. The psalmist tells us while they waited, they used that time to repent. Repentance means changing your mind. It's letting how you see yourself and the world be transformed. It can involve saying good-bye to old things or old ways of living and being. Like the psalmist who wrote this whole song with hope from the depths of pain, we too are waiting.

When we're struggling with the many challenges we are experiencing with COVID-19, we may feel different kinds of emotions. One thing we can do is pray — that is, talk to God and share all of what we feel like the psalmist did. God welcomes all of our emotions. God hears us when we're upset, scared, sad, or mad, as much as when we're happy, proud, and joyful.


Take a moment to think about how you feel when someone you care about is hurting. If you're in a group, share your responses. Just like you care when someone you love is hurting, happy, or scared, remember God also loves us and cares about how we feel. God feels it with us.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What is the hardest thing about waiting?
- 2. What do you do when you're really, really happy?
- 3. What do you do when you feel upset? What makes you feel better?
- 4. Who do you talk to when you need to share how you feel?

Prayer Dear God, thank you for always being with us and caring about us and our feelings. Thank you for always listening when we pray. **Amen.**

A Note from NW MN Synod On Communion at Home

Holy Home Communion

The church is anywhere people gather in Jesus' name. Even though we may not physically gather in a church building, we continue to gather as the Christian church. When you gather in Jesus' name, your home is church, too.



Holy Communion is a special meal we celebrate when we worship. The bread and wine are mysteriously the *real presence* of Jesus Christ. Because mysteries are, well, mysterious, we trust that Jesus is really with us in this meal.

When we cannot gather physically for worship due to an emergency such as COVID-19, it is acceptable to fast from Holy Communion until we can worship together once again <u>or</u> use the liturgy below which can be led by the head of household to celebrate Holy Communion in the home. We believe the meal is celebrated after God's Word is heard, so you might read a passage of scripture together and discuss how God is speaking to you in the biblical story, listen to a recorded sermon or tune into a livestream or radio service, before leading this liturgy. Setting the Table

Prepare a space for the meal of Holy Communion. Just as we do at church, consider setting out your best dishes because this is the most special meal we share. Churches often use unleavened bread to recall the Israelites hurried exodus from Egypt, however any bread will do. You may set out a small cup of wine or grape juice. Light a candle or two, and you have an altar.

Holy Communion Liturgy

Head of Household: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you.

And also with you.

When our congregation gathered for Holy Communion with all the saints from every time and place, we heard again the story of God's mighty acts and the love shown us in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. The holy meal of the Lord's supper was shared.

Even though we gather separately, for now, we share this bread of life and cup of blessing - gifts that that unite and strengthen the Christian community.

Let us confess our sins, all that we have done to hurt each other and ourselves, in the presence of God and of one another. (Pause for a moment of reflection.)

Most merciful God, We confess that we have messed up. With our words and our hands, we have not been kind to others or to our own selves. We are hopeless without your love. We are afraid of running out of things, so we take more than we need. We are afraid of what could happen, so we forget that you are with us all the time to give us peace. We spend the night with worry instead of prayer. Forgive us again and fill us up with your abundant mercy.

God is rich in mercy and love. No matter how much you mess up every day, God's love never runs out. Just as God's love is for you, so is the meal set before us. You are forgiven and ready to feast at the table, in the name of the one who died to set you free from the power of your sin, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Amen.

Holy Home Communion Continued

Words of Institution

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Communion Distribution

Share the bread with each person, saying, "The body of Christ, given for you."

Then share the wine or grape juice with each person, saying, "The blood of Christ, shed for you."

Prayer After Communion

Life-giving God, in the mystery of Christ's resurrection you send light to conquer darkness, water to give new life, and the bread of life to nourish your people and free us from fear. Send us forth as witnesses to your Son's resurrection, that we may show your glory to all the world, through Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. **Amen.**

Communion Bread Recipe


From Luther Seminary to your table

- 1. Sift dry ingredients together three times: (important!) 2. Stir in 4 tsp oil. Set aside.
 - 2 c whole wheat flour
 - 1 c white flour
 - 1 & 1/4 tsp baking powder
 - 1 & 1/4 tsp salt

3. Mix wet ingredients together until dissolved:

3/4 cup + 2 Tbsp very hot water (minimum of 180 degrees F)

- 3 Tbsp honey
- 3 Tbsp molasses
- 4. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and mix well. Dough should be slightly sticky. Do not knead.
- 5. Divide into four balls and flatten each into a 1/4-inch-thick disk.
- 6. With a knife, score the top of each loaf into eight pie-shaped sections, so that the sections can be more easily broken off while serving. Alternatively, you could score a cross onto the loaf.



7. Lay the loaves on a baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and brush the tops of the loaves with oil. Bake an additional 5-8 minutes. Let cool.

Yield: four 8 oz. loaves. Each loaf serves 60-70 people, depending upon the size of the piece given. The loaves freeze well.

Adoption of the Agenda: Motion made by Jodie, Seconded by Larry. Carried

Pastors Report: Installation of council February 16th. Went over hand out of what she had done and completed for the month and what upcoming

events were scheduled.

Secretary's report: A motion to approve the minutes from 1/14/20 meeting by Bonnie seconded by Larry. Carried.

Treasurer's Report: A motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Jodie and seconded by Bonnie. Carried.

Staff Reports:

A. Aimee- Talked about the attendance is currently down 28% and Sunday School is down 41%. Bethel had 4 services scheduled for January and 1 was cancelled due to the weather. Have 3 scheduled for February and so far nothing for March. The wifi at the church has two accounts- one is secure and the other is open to the public. There is concern of possible security risk. After a discussion it was unanimously decided to put a password on the unsecure line and post the password for people to use in the church. Also there has been inquiries about the availability of support/donations from the church. The people seeking help have been directed to the agencies in our community for them to contact. Discussed the need to update the security plan for 2020 and also the School Crisis Evaluation Plan.

The decision was for sure the tin cups in March could be allocated and possibly the men's and woman's groups could help with the fee to make it more affordable for families. She had also checked with Zion out of Thief River Falls about our campers riding on their bus. That way we would just have to find transportation to and from Thief River Falls.

Sue also brought up the need of doing a time and talents survey to find out who is willing to help with the different ministry's of the church. This will be collected and done by the Stewardship committee. They also will be hosting an Oatmeal breakfast bar on 2/16 before church.

She also brought to our attention of people seeking short term emergency help and made a recommendation that we have something in place to where we direct the people to.

- D. Interim Candidate: Keith and Tracey Wensloff are following up with a possible Interim interested in Messiah/Moe. Her name is Jeanie Madsen and she had served at Zion in Warroad 2007 2011.
 - E. Holy Week Schedule: Ash Wednesday is at Messiah and then rotates each week between Moe and Messiah.
