She was U.S. spokesperson and chief political strategist with the International Campaign for Freedom of Aung San Suu Kyi and Burma, and former national speakers bureau member of EPIC (Education for Peace in Iraq Center) and TheocracyWatch.

She's been writing *Frack Attack: Fighting Back* for five years while simultaneously fighting corporate control and the expansion of fossilfuel exploitation and related industries and infrastructure projects. She's a cofounder of the grassroots <u>Coalition to Protect New York</u> and <u>FrackBustersNY</u>, among other groups.

A professionally trained actor and director and MFA-holding playwright, she was also for many years an organic farmer who grew or traded with neighbors for almost all her family's food. During a brief city exile she helped establish Bronx Green-Up, which became a model for urban gardening projects nationwide.
