The recent passing of former First Lady Barbara Bush was met with the celebration of her life and many television networks replaying videos of her and interviews of the former first lady. A 2013 interview conducted as part of a First Ladies of the United States series was aired. As part of the interview, Mrs. Bush was asked about her faith and the afterlife. Her response was, "I'm a huge believer in a loving God," she said. "And I have no fear of death, which is a huge comfort because we're getting darned close. And I don't have a fear of death for my precious George or for myself because I know that there is a great God." To that I have to agree, there is a great God. But I do hope that the faith of the Bush family goes deeper than that.

It is not enough to simply believe in God, or to know about God. James tells us that even the demons believe (2:19). Our assurance of eternal life relies in the finished work of Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12 states "And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other

name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." Some may study about God, but never put their faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus said "I am the way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6). The message of the gospel is summed up in 1 Corinthians 15:3-4 "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." Later in the chapter, Paul explains that the resurrection of Christ is our only hope of resurrection. It is only when we can be found in Jesus Christ that we have hope of eternal life. It is not based on our good works, church attendance or how much money we give.

If you were asked about your hope of eternity, what would your answer be? Would it be simply that you have faith in God? Or that you have surrendered your life to Jesus Christ and your sins are covered by His blood? Are you looking forward to heaven as Mrs. Bush seemed to indicate? Some may have an indication that their life is drawing to a close; others have no indication that when they get up in the morning it is the last time they will be getting out of bed. We have no promise of another day, another hour, another moment. If you have not put your faith in Jesus, what are you waiting for?



Pat Answers

Where Did the Term Easter come from and what does it mean?

We just celebrated Easter on April 1st, but I was asked recently "Where did the word 'EASTER' come from? Isn't what we refer to as Easter better said to be RESURRECTION DAY?" Yes, Amen! It is clear that we use the term Easter today as a reference to the rising of Jesus Christ from the dead. Praise God! But the origins of the word Easter are debated along two main lines, pagan and Christian. The modern English term Easter, cognate with modern Dutch ooster and German Ostern, developed from an Old English word that usually appears in the form *Eastrun*. Some say the original meaning came from a pagan goddess who was the goddess of the sunrise and the spring. The direction of the sunrise, East, or German "Ost" is named for her. In Norse mythology, the name is spelled Eostare. Eastre then is believed to be an ancient word for spring, mentioned by the English monk Bede in the 700's, saying that April was the month of Eostre. If this is the case, Christians took the old word for the spring and its festival but gave it a new Christian meaning – the life-giving resurrection of Jesus.

Another idea involves the history of the Frankish church (Germans who settled in Rome during the fifth century). Their celebration of Christ's resurrection included the word *alba*, which means white (the color of the robes worn during the resurrection festival). *Alba* also meant sunrise. So when the name of the festival

was translated into German, the sunrise meaning, ostern, was selected, likely in error. One theory is that Ostern is the origin of the word Easter.

The Answers in Genesis website gives another Christian origin of the word Easter: "Contrary to suggesting a connection to a Saxon goddess, some have suggested Easter finds its root in the German word for resurrection—auferstehung...Oster comes from the old Teutonic form of auferstehen / auferstehung, which means resurrection, which in the older Teutonic form comes from two words, Ester meaning first, and stehen meaning to stand. These two words combine to form erstehen which is an old German form of auferstehen, the modern day German word for resurrection."

So the bottomline is we may not know for sure the exact origins of the word Easter. But I agree with my questioner, RESURRECTION DAY is a better term for followers of Christ to use than Easter. But the main thing is that now we know the real meaning of Easter is all about the resurrection of Jesus. It is not about the bunny, it is about the Lamb. "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep." – 1 Corinthians 15:20. Let us daily be thankful for a Living Risen Savior,
