## Franklin County Office on Aging

### **MISSION:**

The purpose of the Office on Aging is to provide centralized access to diverse programs and individualized services for older adults and their families so they can preserve their independence.

### **PROGRAMS AND SERVICES:**

- ☐ **Senior Options** - system of care for persons ages 60 and older; funded by the Senior Services Levy. Services include information and advocacy, case management, homemaker services, personal care, caregiver relief, emergency response systems, home delivered meals, medical transportation, adult day services and minor home repair. **(614) 462-6200**
- ☐ **Adult Protective Services** - intended to assist impaired adults who may be harmed due to abuse, neglect or exploitation. **(614) 462-4348**

## **Franklin County Senior Options**

Franklin County Senior Options helps Franklin County residents age 60 and older maintain their independence.

Senior Options has been providing community-based services since 1993. These services include: home delivered meals, homemaker services, personal care, respite care, adult day care, transportation, emergency response systems, minor home repair and information and advocacy.

Franklin County Senior Options, administered by the Franklin County Office on Aging, is the one-stop shopping point for information and access to senior services. A single call to Franklin County Senior Options at **(614) 462-6200** connects older adults and their families with a caring professional trained to help solve seniors' problems.

Senior Options is funded by the five-year Senior Services Levy passed by the voters in 1992, 1997, 2002 and 2007.

Approximately 5,000 older adults receive Senior Options services monthly. Over 70 percent of the participants are female, over 50 percent are over 75 years of age, and 30 percent have identified themselves as members of minority groups. Over 2,000 callers per month contact Senior Options for information and referral or access to services.

Nutritious lunches, snacks and door-to-door transportation are also provided. Life Center provides adult day services where seniors and adults with disabilities receive an individualized plan of daytime care. The program serves the southeast quadrant of Franklin county and portions of Fairfield and Licking counties.

Therapeutic activities and socialization are incorporated in a well-supervised completely accessible home-like environment. Programs include assistance in daily living activities, art, crafts, intergenerational programs, music therapy, exercise therapy and bathing. A registered nurse is always on duty, a full-time social worker is on staff and all the staff is C.P.R. certified.

Our Caregiving team facilitates opportunities for Clients to maintain their maximum health and wellness while the family caregiver is relieved of caregiving responsibilities for as many days per week as needed.

The daily charge includes meals, snacks, cultural, recreational and educational activities. Open Monday-Friday, 6:30 am - 5:30 pm and Saturday 9:00 am - 5:00 pm. Times and hours can be adapted to individual needs. Accessible transportation is available within a predetermined radius for an additional charge.

## **MEDICARE**

All persons 65 or over who qualify for Social Security benefits are eligible for Medicare Parts A and B. Part A is hospital insurance which you receive as part of your Social Security. Part B is medical insurance that carries a monthly charge and is deducted from your Social Security check if you wish to have it. Part B pays 80% of the allowed costs of most physicians' services, laboratory and radiology, outpatient hospital benefits and other health benefits.

Individuals receiving Social Security disability benefits and chronic renal disease benefits are entitled to Medicare beginning the 25th month of disability. You may qualify for Part B if you are not eligible for Social Security benefits.

Medicare now offers prescription drug coverage to people eligible for Medicare Part A and/or Part B. To enroll in Medicare, telephone your local Social Security Office at least three months before you reach age 65 (*see Social Security*).

Monthly retirement benefits are payable as early as 62 to any person who has worked a prescribed number of years in Social Security-covered employment.

Monthly disability payments are available at any age to people who have met certain Social Security-covered employment requirements and who have a disabling condition. Widows and widowers may receive a monthly payment as early as age 60, and as early as age 50 if disabled.

Supplemental Security Income (S.S.I.) is administered by the Social Security Administration for people age 65 and older, and to blind and disabled individuals, including children, whose income and resources are below specified levels.
