Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For this month I thought I would pull out a story that is an oldie but goody. I feel this story is a creative way to explain the definitive Easter story. I hope you enjoy the imaginative line of reasoning.

In the UCC we like tag lines and symbols to express how we see ourselves as a denomination. One of the tag lines of the UCC is "never put a period where God has put a comma." This saying is taken from something *Gracie Allen* once said and is the basis of our denominations campaign to tell the world that "God is still speaking." The 'comma' along with the saying "God is Still Speaking" is a campaign of the U.C.C. to help people outside the denomination understand how the United Church of Christ balances religious tradition with new ideas so the denomination may continue to be relevant. This idea of using punctuation marks to explain something is not exclusive to the UCC. Thank goodness – since the UCC strives to be an inclusive denomination who welcomes extravagantly so that "No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here."

In a little known book titled <u>If I Should Die Before I Live</u> by Joe LoMusio, this very same idea is proposed by Mr. LoMusio. In his book he asks – if you were to describe Easter without any words but only punctuation marks how would you do it? What punctuation marks would you use to describe Easter? Well for me, I would have to agree with Mr. LoMusio and it would have to be [.? !!!!!!] If we consider the events that took place prior to Jesus resurrection, His death would definitely be a (.) period. After Jesus was crucified, dead and buried everything stopped or so it must have seemed for those who had followed Jesus. All the expectations came to an end as far as the disciples could understand. Jesus was in a tomb wrapped in a linen cloth - PERIOD.

Next came the question mark, what will happen now, Jesus is gone, the question mark is worse than the period. The people are perplexed, they are questioning what has happened, what should they do, are they the next to be crucified - QUESTIONS.

But wait – word of an empty tomb, another question – where is He, the stone is rolled away and the linen lay there without the One who it was to cover. Someone speaks – the living One is not here among the dead, He is RISEN!!!! Remember how He said He would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days – of course they remembered.

The periods are gone – the question marks have been pushed aside and

what is left is a massive EXCLAMATION point.

YES, that describes EASTER . It is the exclamation of Jesus' passion – the exclamation of the resurrection that changed the world - the exclamation that death cannot hinder the power of God - the exclamation that all who believe in Jesus as savior of the world no longer have to fear death because death has been defeated by the power and love of God. Easter is the exclamation of God's plan to show us the way!

May the joy and gladness of Easter move you to delight as you remember that we are an Easter people - living on the Easter side of the cross of new life and salvation. Happy Easter everyone.



Reminder from Cemetery Association:

Guidelines for placing flowers and floral arrangements on the Ben Salem Cemetery

Due to the problems with wind carrying pieces of artificial flower arrangements into the neighboring farm fields - which become a hazard to machinery, crops and animals - and because they can also present a danger to our own mowing equipment - the following guidelines have been established by the Cemetery Association:

- 1. All types of real or potted plants are acceptable. Please remove colored foil from potted plant containers before placement. Any type of trees are <u>not</u> acceptable in the cemetery.
- 2. We ask that no artificial flowers and arrangements be placed on our cemeteries from May 1 through October 31.
- 3. Prior to placement of Christmas arrangements, make certain that artificial pieces are securely fastened to the arrangement.
- ****All Christmas arrangements should be removed from gravesites by March 1st weather permitting.
- 4. Appropriate signs for the guidelines will be placed at the cemeteries.
- 5. As a courtesy to persons living away from the area, floral arrangements may be placed at gravesites by contacting the Cemetery Association.
- 6. After April 30, the Cemetery Association will remove artificial arrangements.
- 7. Solar powered decorative sticks are acceptable by gravestones.

Graduate Recognition will be held on June 11 at both services. Names should be submitted by May 17 to be included in the June newsletter. Please include majors and degrees if you wish.



<u>Richard and Cynthia Smith Scholarship Fund:</u>

Applications for the Smith Scholarship Fund can be obtained by calling the Church Office at 570-386-3870. The forms can be sent in the mail or e-mailed to those who wish to apply. This fund was established to assist high school graduates who are furthering their education. The applicant must be a member in good standing of Ben Salem UCC. The applicant must have graduated from high school and be enrolled as a full time, undergraduate student in an accredited college or technical school to further his/her education. A person may only be a recipient of this scholarship one time but if you have applied in a prior year and not been a recipient of the scholarship, you may apply again. Preference will be given to those who have a financial need, who are loyal to the church, its worship and life, and who have performed community service. Applications should be submitted to the Church Office by June 30, 2017.

They also stay in touch with these families to offer support after their children have passed. Since its inception in 2013, "Dylan and Gavin's Rainbow" has helped over 100 local families. 
