

Certified Medication Aide Study Guide Course

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Course Description:

The two-day WIC class will give you 16 CEU hours and will include the following sections:

- Basic Medication Administration Information and Medical Terminology
- Using appropriate techniques to obtain and record vital signs.
- Administration of Medication including specialized techniques
- Monitoring a resident's condition and reaction to medications
- Infection control principles including handwashing technique
- Documentation
- Medication storage
- Dosage forms and routes for medication
- Clean dressing change
- Self-Administration of medication by resident
- **HEALTH MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES:** Insulin Injections, Epinephrine Injections, B12 Injections, Clean dressing changes, Nebulizer treatments, and Glucose Checks.

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Q: What is the Georgia ALC Medication Aide Registry?

A: The Georgia ALC Medication Aide Registry is the web-based system for listing unlicensed persons who have qualified to administer certain medications in assisted living communities (ALCs) as permitted by Georgia law, O.C.G.A. §31-7-12.2.

Q: Who may be listed on the Georgia ALC Medication Aide Registry?

A: Only Georgia-Certified Nurse Aides (CNAs) in good standing who successfully complete the Georgia Medication Aide Training Program may be listed on the Georgia ALC Medication Aide Registry.
