State News Updates

April 5, 2020

- Governor Cuomo held a press conference at 11:00 AM and provided the following information:
 - o Total cases 122,031:
 - 16,479 currently hospitalized.
 - 4,376 ICU patients.
 - 12,187 patents discharged.
 - o Total deaths 4,159, up from 3,565.
 - For the non-vulnerable population, the health care system makes a real difference.
 - 74% of those hospitalized have been discharged.
 - o Hospital system is over capacity:
 - To handle this, need to flex the hospitals to work together as one system.
 - Must shift staff, resources, and supplies to the locations that need it.
 - Federal Government is deploying approximately 1,000 personnel to New York including:
 - Doctors, nurses, respiratory technicians and therapists.
 - Priority is to New York City public hospitals.
 - O New Yorkers should deal with the "cabin fever" that accompanies the Coronavirus.
 - Feeling of isolation, mood swings, resentment of people around you, prone to irrational outbursts.
 - o Treatments are being expedited right now:
 - Vaccine.
 - Convalescent plasma.
 - Receptor antibody treatment.
 - Hydroxychloroquine.
