After the last FAN meeting on August 14th I have been inspired to work on my entries for the Dare to Differ Quilt exhibition for Sept 2013. The group talked about what defines a contemporary art quilt and how to make them more 3D while maintaining the 2 layers stitched together format. I have come up with what I think is a nifty way to add depth and perspective to my quilt while keeping it with the guidelines. But it's a secret so you will have to hope my quilt makes it into the exhibition to see it.

What is a.....Felbi?



Felbi Wool Bats or pre-felts are a fabric made from the finest merino wool. The fabric is designed for wet or needle felting. The Felbi eliminates the need to layout a base of cross hatched fibre that the design is constructed on top of. With wet felting the fibres are laid on top of the Felbi then wet felted into the surface. There is a shrinkage rate when wet felting so the finished item will be up to 50% smaller than the starting point.

With needle felting the fibres are laid on top then felted through the Felbi. Shrinkage is minimal with needle felting. The Felbi gives a smooth finish and is good for other felting techniques incorporating additional fibres or Nuno felting. I use Fibre Fusion Felbi's. www.fibrefusion.com.au


Blog Spot

The plastic trays came from Kmart and each has a layer of non slip matting to stop the threads sliding around. I have used colour trays to make it easy to tell the poly threads from the embroidery and decorative threads.
