

Quilt Show

The 43rd Annual Quilters Unlimited Quilt Show will be held June 3-5, 2016 at the Dulles Expo Center in Chantilly, Virginia. The theme will be Virginia's Beautiful Waters. The show will feature a special exhibit of 177 quilts inspired by the National Parks. Quilters from local Quilters Unlimited chapters will exhibit over 600 beautiful quilts from traditional to modern to art quilts. Show hours are Friday 10-6, Saturday 10-5, and Sunday 10-4. Admission is \$10 for one day or \$15 for all three days.

We encourage travel to the show by bus. There is ample parking at the Expo Center. As in years past the Publicity Co-Chairs will meet buses upon arrival to provide admission wristbands, programs, and exit surveys. We are offering any attendees coming by bus a reduced admission of \$9 per person if payment is received in advance. Bus coordinators will receive two complimentary admission tickets. The 2016 show may offer some one-half day courses or mini-workshops that may appeal to bus groups.

Service Projects

The Service Project Committee has been working hard to find small projects that PPQG members can make next year. We will have ballots for voting on the projects at the December meetings. If you at not going to be at the December meetings and still want to vote, send your 2 choices to gala.damato@gmail.com before December 11th. Votes will be counted after the December day chapter meeting. An email will be sent out announcing which projects were chosen so you can start working on projects for the January meetings. A brief explanation of the projects are listed below:

- Fidget quilts for Riverside Hospital, DePaul Hospital and Dominion Village in Poquoson. These are small quilts with different textures, zippers and Velcro to keep the hands busy of elderly patients with Alzheimer's disease.
- 2. Developmental hearts and small comfort quilt for CHKD. These are 6 inch hearts made of cotton or flannel scraps to be worn against the skin of parents with babies in NICU. The hearts are then placed in with the babies with their parents scent on them. We would continue the small comfort quilts for babies that get to go home but don't have a good prognosis. A pattern will be provided for the hearts.
- 3. Place mats for Peninsula Aging Agency Meals on Wheels Program. Place mats would be given out in sets of 2 and neutral colors were requested. PAA also has a need for walker and wheel chair bags for patients living in nursing homes. A pattern will be provided or you can make up your own pattern.
- 4. Wheel chair lap quilts for patients receiving cancer treatments at Riverside. The approximate size of these quilts would be 32" by 40". It needs to cover their laps to their ankles for warmth but not so long it gets in the wheels of the chair.

Service Project Committee members are Gala Damato, Pat Winters, Joan Cochran, Ellen Wood and Maggie Haley. Thank you for generously supporting PPQG Service Projects.

- The meeting was adjourned at 12:00 p.m.







BLOCK OF THE MONTH for NOVEMBER 2015 ... HAYES CORNER, 12" (finished), 12½" raw edge size

Your kit should contain: TWO 2½x6½" green rectangles, SIX 2½x4½" green rectangles, FOUR 2½" white squares, ONE 5" white square, TWO 2½" yellow squares, FOUR 2½" red squares and ONE 5" red square. PLEASE STRIVE VERY HARD FOR AN ACCURATE 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE ... If you find you are having difficulty getting the 1/4" seam, www.learnhowtoquilt.com has good videos, as both a refresher and some good tips. We all know how frustrating it can be to have a block not come out the way you had hoped! MEASURE YOUR BLOCK WHEN IT IS DONE TO BE SURE IT IS 12½" !!!



 Make the small corner four-patches. Sew a white square to a yellow square, and a white square to a red square. Press toward the color. Seam these together so it looks like this: Make another one just like this!

This little 4-patch should measure 4½" square in its unfinished state.

 Stitch a small red square to a short green rectangle. Add another short green rectangle to the left of the four patch, then add this red/ green unit that you just made to the bottom of this unit. Result should look like this:

Make the other one look just like this as well!

Oooo ... take time to check your accuracy. These units should measure 6½" from edge to edge in their unfinished state. If yours is too small, then your seams are too large. If yours is too large, then your seams are too small!

- On the back of the large white square, lightly draw a diagonal line. Put this together with the large red square, right sides together, and stitch a scant ¼" on either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line. Press toward the red. NOW TRIM THESE EACH TO 4½".
- 4. To the left side of the new half-square red/white unit, stitch a small green rectangle. Press toward the green. Then stitch a larger green rectangle to the top of the unit. Again press toward the green. It should look like this:
 Make the other one just like it!




this unit to 4½" square, keeping the triangle points at the exact corners of your square.

Very important to trim

Once again take time to check your accuracy. These units should measure 6½" from edge to edge in their unfinished state. If yours is too small, then your seams are too large. If yours is too large, then your seams are too small!


5. Assemble the units. Make two that look just like this; press toward the right on both.



6. Now seam those two together, so the resulting block looks like this:
