CCEFC sent a team of five to El Salvador last year. Both pastors that we served then have been in close contact with us and have invited us to come back. The same team of five plus four others will be heading to El Salvador, Lord willing. We will be flying out on January 6, returning on January 15.

Both pastors have asked that we run a Vacation Bible School. They have asked us to be prepared for 100-150 kids in Tepititan and 75 kids in Citala. We will also be doing a building project in both towns.

The VBS theme is Respect – respect for God, parents and others. To quote Pastor Wilfredo, "Nowadays respect is lost and we want our children to be different". As you can tell, Pastor Wilfredo is a Godly man with a vision – he's a great guy to work with!

We have found a company that we can buy craft supplies from that will send them to El Salvador, so we will be asking for money for the supplies instead of having items donated. The items that need to be

Recently I was watching television and the program I was watching came to an end. The following program began, which featured a preacher. (I did not note the name of the preacher or the program). This preacher began talking about "The Jesus we deserve", "The Jesus I deserve", and telling others of "the Jesus they deserve".

The issue with this is that no one deserves Jesus; we deserve to spend eternity in eternal hell. We have the opportunity to know of Jesus and His work on the Cross only because of God's mercy and Grace. To deserve Jesus would mean that it is based on our good works. Isaiah 64:6 tells us that our good works are filth to God. Ephesians 2 reminds us that our works will not get us into right favor with God, but it is only through His grace.

This is but one example of the plethora of false teachings that can be found around us today. It may be over the airwaves (or cable...), books, or local churches. We must become Bereans and search out the scriptures

to determine if the teaching we are hearing is consistent with scripture (Acts 17:10). Some will use a single verse, or part of a verse to make a case for a theological conclusion. This conclusion is inconsistent with scripture. Be careful of teachers who use a text to prove a point that fail to take in the context of that verse.

The new year is a good time to plan to become more acquainted with your Bible. Reading it regularly (daily) and meditating on the text. As you read ask some basic questions: Who is writing? Who is being written to? What do we know about these people? When was this written in terms of all of history? In terms of Biblical revelation? Where are the events taking place? What do we know about the area? What is being said? What action is taking place? How would the contemporaries understand the passage? Why was this being written? What is the message for us today? What do other passages have to say on this topic?

Will you dedicate yourself this year to becoming more familiar with your Bible?



The freedom of forgiveness

Martin Luther King Jr. called forgiveness "a permanent attitude," as opposed to "an occasional act." Maintaining a forgiveness mind-set leads to peace and freedom.

Author and pastor Max Anders experienced that freedom in seminary. After cheating on a Hebrew final, he was distraught and confessed his sin to God and the professor. "I felt deeply cleaned. Pure. Holy," Anders writes in *21 Unbreakable Laws of Life*. "I wanted to laugh and cry at the same time. I wanted to run and jump and dance. The burden was lifted. … I was free!"

By contrast, he writes, "If we don't ask for forgiveness when we wrong someone, we lose our moral authority; the debris of sin begins to accumulate in our hearts, choking our conscience Others know when we sin against them, and if we don't make it right, it hurts our reputation as well as God's."

- Write in the journal daily


 or whenever possible –

PLANS FOR THE **NEW YEAR**



prepared ahead of time or that we already have will be going in our suitcases. If you are interested in donating for crafts or helping cut and prepare these items, please let Stacey Coville or Terrie Schwartz know.

Both towns are extremely poor. We have been asked to build a home for a church member named Hector in Tepititan. It will cost about \$1100.00. Pastor Oscar asked us to build a latrine for a church family that has 8 children in Citala. This project will cost about \$600. It is interesting that they have asked for us to help members of their church family, not the actual church building or either of the pastor's homes. These are some very kind, loving families!

There are some needs beyond the Vacation Bible School and building project that Pastor Wilfredo and Pastor Oscar have asked us about. If you would like to provide money toward any of these items, please put it in our church offering clearly marked.

- 50 chairs (\$9 each)
- Overhead projector (they want to hold evangelistic events in the city park)
- 2 microphones
- Fans

If you have a projector or microphone to donate, we could take it in our luggage. Please see Terrie or Dana if you have questions about filling any of these needs.

The last thing that they have asked for is help getting electricity to the home of another church member, Santiago, in Tepititan. He is Pastor Wilfredo's right-hand man. He and his wife are about 70 years old and are raising their granddaughter because both of her parents have died. They live in a structure built into the side of a hill. The cost for this is \$302. Dark Chocolate Salted Caramel Oreo Pie

Ingredients

1 package (about 36) whole Oreos

1 cup (16 tablespoons) butter, divided

2/3 cup packed brown sugar

1 1/4 cup heavy whipping cream, divided

1 (12 oz) bag dark chocolate chips

Directions

- Finely crush the Oreos with a food processor or blender. Stir crumbs together with 8 tablespoons melted butter until well combined. Press into the bottom and sides of a pie pan. Freeze crust for 10 minutes until set.
- 2. Combine remaining 8 tablespoons butter and brown sugar in a small saucepan. Cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, until mixture begins to bubble. Continue cooking, whisking constantly, for 1 minute. Remove from heat. Slowly whisk in 1/4 cup heavy whipping cream until smooth. Cool caramel about 15 minutes. Pour the caramel over the Oreo crust, then return to freezer for about 30-45 minutes until just chilled and set. (You don't want the caramel to fully freeze.)
- 3. Place chocolate chips in a glass bowl. In a saucepan, bring 1 cup heavy whipping cream to a simmer over medium-high heat. Pour the cream over the chocolate chips and let sit for 5 minutes, then whisk until completely smooth. Pour the chocolate over the caramel and freeze for a final 30 minutes, until just chilled and set. OR refrigerate, covered, until ready to serve. Before serving, sprinkle the top with a flaky sea salt

Store covered in the refrigerator and serve chilled. **Makes 8-12 servings**.

So is there a Good Word as we Begin 2018?

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present Help in trouble" – Psalm 46:1. May we daily say with King David, the sweet psalmist of Israel – "I love you, O LORD, my strength. The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. I call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies." – Psalm 18:1-3.

None of us knows what lies ahead in 2018, but GOD does!!! Our trust, our hope, our confidence are all in Him. We know no matter what that He is in control and working all things after the counsel of His will – Ephesians 1:11; Psalm 115:3. He is also working

So let us take comfort and joy in the Lord and His Word. A good summary statement of our assurance in Christ is from the Heidelberg Catechism from 1563, the very first question: "What is your only comfort in life and in death?

That I, with body and soul, both in life and in death, am not my own, but belong to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ, who with His precious blood has fully satisfied for all my sins, and redeemed me from all the power of the devil; and so preserves me that without the will of my Father in heaven not a hair can fall from my head; indeed, that all things must work together for my salvation. Wherefore, by His Holy Spirit, He also assures me of eternal life, and makes me heartily willing and ready from now on to live unto Him."
