A motion was made by Lois Bates and seconded by Carol Richardson to approve the May minutes. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Motion to accept the treasurer's report in the May newsletter was made by Kitty Tully and seconded by Linda Tyler. The report was approved for audit. The report was unanimously approved for audit.

The June birthdays were acknowledged and fat guarters were distributed.

Announcements

- From the President Isobel Meekins (recycled president) thanked the outgoing board members for all they did. The board members are all open to suggestions, so please talk to them. Newsletter deadline is always the 20th of the month. Donna D'Amelio is the editor. Contact her if you have anything for the newsletter. Congratulations to Joy Duke, who just published an article, "Grab That Freezer Paper," in the online June issue of Quilt Pattern Magazine. Thanks to the Challenge Committee, especially Crystalann Duarte, Yvette Cienski, and Gala Damato.
- Raffle Quilt Allison Twilley announced that Jeanne Harrison, a new member who joined last month, has volunteered to quilt the raffle quilt.
- Symposium Kitty Tully, co-chair, announced that the committee will meet on Wednesday, June 10 at 6:30 P.M. at the Hilton Baptist Church. Raquelle Hill, chair, will attend by phone or Skype.
- Workshops Jeanne Vaul reminded us that several national speakers will be coming our way in 2015 and 2016. She invited us to take a flyer to get more information.
- Honor Quilts Sherry Behun and Gala Damato took 20 quilts to Walter Reed Rehab Center. The Marines chose their own quilts. Sherry has photos on her iPad, and will gladly show them. A colonel accepted a signature quilt; it's the first donation he has ever accepted, and he served 3 tours in Afghanistan. Sherry has two quilts that need to be quilted. Sherry thanked Gala for her help. One member asked about sizes. Sherry is accepting lap size to twin.
- Service Projects Gala Damato gave out more quilts to CHKD. They are accepting comfort quilts for the NICU unit, and would appreciate some bereavement quilts. Gala is looking for a helper. Christy Stafford, the NICU nurse, is glad to give tours and show us where our quilts are going. There was a question about the sizes for comfort quilts for babies that go home but don't have a good prognosis. Gala said they should be 24 to 36 inches and can be made with brighter and happier fabrics.
- Monthly Mini Joy Duke thanked the donors, Barbara Linde (bead box) and Denise Vassar (2 tissue box covers). Joy asked for donations for August onward. She let us know that Nancy Garnett has one foot in a cast and is not able to attend meetings right now. Joy had a card for us to sign.
- 2015 Challenge Crystalann Duarte and Yvette Cienski complimented everyone for their efforts and talent. Crystalann explained the voting rules: every member can vote once--either Tuesday night or Friday morning. Each member will get a little bag with three beads and a button. (Thanks to Yvette's daughters for filling the bags.) The button is for Viewer's Choice. The beads are for first, second, and third place awards. The winners will get a gift. Yvette and Crystalann said they would transport quilts from the Tuesday to the Friday meeting if anyone needs that done. Carol Richardson asked if the quilt had to be at both meetings. Yvette and Crystalann said they didn't have that rule, but if someone really wanted to win, she would have brought the quilt for both meetings. They will accept quilts on Friday. They would like the quilts to be available for the Mid Atlantic Quilt Show in February, as the Guild already has a space at the show for the display.

Yvette asked us to return the bags to her so she can refill them. The winners will be announced at the meeting on Friday, but they don't have to be present to win. Yvette and Crystalann will hold onto guilts that can't be picked up on Friday.

There was some discussion about the procedures for tallying the votes. Sandy Curran asked about the counting procedure. Yvette and Crystalann will count the number of beads in each bag first, and then buttons. The quilt with the most buttons wins Viewer's Choice. The quilt with the most bead wins first place.

Some members don't understand the difference between Viewer's Choice and First Place. Crystalann said they thought Viewer's Choice was better to say than Best of Show. Viewer's Choice is "what grabs you," and might not necessarily reflect the best use of color, techniques, etc.

- **Break** Jeanne announced a break from 7:30-8:00 P.M. Members voted for their favorite Challenge guilts during the break.
- **Reconvene** Jeanne reconvened the meeting at 8:00 P.M.

- Quilt-o Box Debra Stebbins requested buttons for the Quilt-o button box collection. Program The program was the display of the Challenge Quilts.

- Show and Tell 13 members showed their quilts. Monthly Mini Monthly Mini winners were Yvette Cienski, Linda O'Dell, and Barbara Linde. We made \$41.00 Door Prizes Door prizes were drawn.
- Set Up Jeanne will need help to set up tables and chairs at 6:00 P.M. Volunteers can just show up.
- Adjourn After door prizes, the meeting was adjourned at 8:18 P. M.

Service Project Update

We received a thank you note from CHKD for the 30 small quilts we gave them in May. The note from the NICU Family Advisory Council thanked us for donating the beautiful handmade quilts for babies in CHKD NICU. The note said our time and dedication is very much appreciated. Ellen Wood, Joan Cochran, and Pat Winters have asked to help with Service Projects. We will meet as a group and before the end of the year will present some choices for service projects for PPQG members in 2016.

In June we received 3 small quilts for CHKD NICU, 6 bereavement quilts, 3 quilts and 1 wall hanging for NATASHA House. Thank you to all the members that so generously support our Service Projects. 3 quilts were given to NATASHA House on June 19th.

For the rest of 2015, we will continue to support CHKD NICU and Portsmouth Naval Hospital. CHKD has asked for small comfort quilts that will go home with children that don't have the best prognosis and children that graduate from their NICU program. You can use brighter and happier fabric for these quilts. The quilts can be between 26 and 36 inches. Portsmouth has asked for bereavement quilts to be 22 to 24 inches square now. Night Chapter Speaker for July Evelyn Townsend

I was born in Maine and lived there until my mid thirties. At that time, my husband and I and our two children moved to upstate New York where we lived for eight years, before moving to Richmond in 1996. We have been here ever since. My profession was banking which I did for most all my life.

I started quilting in the early 1980's having been a sewer since I was about the age of twelve. Beginning in the early 1990's I started making quilts on commission. In 2008, I purchased a longarm quilting machine which I kept for about five years. I have since sold that and now I quilt using a Babylock Tiara which is a table model for all my quilts.

Having retired from banking at the beginning of 2014, I quilt now for pleasure and enjoy teaching and lecturing occasionally. My quilts have been shown in national quilt shows such as Paducah and Houston as well as locally with the Richmond Quilt Guild and the State Fair of Virginia. Most of my quilts involve some method of embellishment, mostly fabric painting and the use of decorative threads. I design all my quilts using Electric Quilt software.

Day Chapter Block of the Month Tips

This past month, Corrine added some tips in the BOM instructions and we were asked to put some in the newsletter. We've even heard from some people that they haven't attempted BOM due to difficulties getting a 1/4" seam, so this first tip pertains to sewing that perfect seam. If you go to www.learnhowtoquilt.com you will find a series of tutorials under "Beginner Basics" that provide both instructions and tips. Some were things I've heard in the past, and maybe even wrote down, but had forgotten.

Our next tip pertains to sewing four-patch units and having them lie flatter. After the four pieces have been sewn together, but BEFORE you press, pick apart the few stitches in the seam allowance on both sides so that they are free to move. Then, when pressing them, press so that the seams all lie in a circular direction.

As we give more tips in our BOM instructions, we'll be sure to include them here in the newsletter. See the next page of this newsletter for the BOM instruction sheet for completing the block for June.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH for JUNE 2015 ... 12" RIBBON STAR

Your kit should contain: ONE blue 4½" square, EIGHT blue 2½" squares, SIX-TEEN white 2½" squares, FOUR gold 2½"x4½" rectangles, and FOUR red 2½"x4½" rectangles. PLEASE STRIVE VERY HARD FOR AN ACCURATE 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE ... If you find you are having difficulty getting the 1/4" seam, **www.learnhowtoquilt.com** has good videos, as both a refresher and some good tips. We all know how frustrating it can be to have a block not come out the way you had hoped!

- 1. Make the corner four patch units. Seam eight small blue squares to eight white squares in pairs. **PRESS** toward blue. Now seam each of these pairs into a four-patch. Press. Or use **PIECING TIP #1.**
- 2. Make the ribbon units. On the remaining eight white squares, lightly draw a diagonal on the wrong side of the fabric.
- 3. Find the four RED rectangles. Place a white square, wrong sides together, at the top end of each rectangle. Align the diagonal so that it looks like the picture. Stitch along the drawn line. Press toward the RED. THEN trim out the fabric triangles beneath.






- 4. Find the four GOLD rectangles. Place a white square, wrong sides together, at the top end of each rectangle. Align the diagonal so that it looks like the picture. Stitch along the drawn line. Press toward the WHITE. THEN trim out the fabric triangles beneath.
- Place one gold unit on top of one red unit so that the resulting seam will enable the unit to look like the picture of the quilt block. See **PIECING TIP #2.** Also **PIECING TIP #3.** Press toward gold.
- Now, time to assemble as a gigantic 9 patch. Follow the arrows which indicate the pressing direction.




Pick out these few stitches on both sides (stitching shown in green for clarity).

NOW press so that the center forms a spiral on the reverse ... see how flat it lies!



PIECING TIP #3. Start the stitching of this seam from the top (white) edge of the seam. If they are not exactly the same size, the difference will end up at the bottom, which you can then "fudge" when you attach that to another unit. The outside edge of the block will remain true, which is important in trying to keep those points 1/4" from the outside edge of the block. Use this technique in assembling the rest of the block as well.
