The members of the Leaders Council hope that you all will join us for our next General Meeting to be held on Thursday, April 19 at 6:15PM at the Fist Baptist Church on the corner of $7^{\text {th }}$ and Grand Ave. We will be asking the members to approve the new Club by-laws that were sent out to each member through the March Newsletter.
Important parts of the new Club By-laws include:

1. Membership year changing to January to December (replacing the current July to June)
2. Current membership dues will carry members through December $30^{\text {th }}$ when our next Membership dues will be collected.
3. Membership dues for 2019 will be $\$ 35$ per member if paid during the month of January 2019, otherwise, dues will cost members $\$ 40$ per member.
4. The revised By-laws also spell out specific compensation for Ambassador Coordinators
5. And various terms of the By-laws have been updated to reflect current terminology being used by FFI in Atlanta
The Leaders Council also plan to distribute a newly developed "New Member Orientation Packet" to all members to help everyone better understand our organization.
So, you can see that just as Spring and new growth has begun to fill the air of the Western Slope, our Club is also showing signs of exciting new growth and many changes. WE HOPE THAT ALL COME OUT ON APRIL $19^{\text {TH }}$ AND JOIN US FOR FUN, FELLOWSHIP, AND NEW JOURNEYS.
