Please read again all the information below so that we are all aware how we can behave safely and protect each other. This may seem a lot to remember but like everything else we have had to do over the last year, we will soon get used to it!

Service Dates and times

We plan to hold our services every Sunday at 10.30am (doors open from 10am).

Bookings

Once again, you will need to book in advance to attend a Service. This is because the capacity of our Church has been much reduced by the need to observe social distance.

You will need to book in each week. Bookings can be made by phone, text or email.

Please contact Jayne McLaren on 07859 062 692 (jayniemac@hotmail.co.uk) from 4pm on the Sunday afternoon for the following Sunday's Service.

Places will be given on a **first come first served basis**. If we can't book you in for the coming Sunday, we will put you on the list for the following Sunday.

If you wish to sit as part of a family group, please tell us at the time of booking so that we can arrange seats together for you.

If you book and then find that you can't come to a Service, please let us know as it will create space for others to come.

Please don't "turn up" at Church if you haven't booked for that Service as it will be frustrating for you to have to go home.

It is essential that you do not come to Church if you are showing symptoms of Covid 19 or have recently come into contact with someone who is suspected of or confirmed to be infected. For all of us, including those who show no symptoms, getting a test (if available) in the week before coming to Church will help us to know we are safe when we have contact with others. Please do come when it is safe for you to do so. If you are in a vulnerable group, please think carefully about whether it is safe for you to attend. We have prepared the Church by cleaning and other measures.

Clothes to suit the Temperature

You may wish to wrap up well to come to Church. The heating will be on and is now working on full power, but we need to ensure good air circulation by keeping some doors open. Please do not close any doors that the stewards have left open. Hopefully, the weather will be much warmer in the coming weeks than it was back in December!

Please don't bring unnecessary bags or other items as they could potentially carry and transmit the virus

Lifts to Church

If you normally give a lift to someone or get picked up by someone to come to Church, please be aware that this is an informal, private arrangement between friends. Lifts are not arranged by the Church and are not offered on behalf of the Church. Please check the current Government guidance before giving or accepting a lift and ensure that any sharing of transport is carried out in a Covid 19 secure way

Face Coverings Required

For now we are still required to wear a face covering at Church, as we are in shops and other enclosed spaces.

You will notice that those on duty will be wearing face coverings for your protection. Children under 11 are not required to wear face coverings. Some adults may also be exempt.

Arriving at Church

The doors will open 30 minutes before the Service begins. Please do not arrive before then. When you arrive at Church you will be greeted by a Steward and be expected to clean your hands before entering. If there is a queue to enter or to use the sanitiser, please observe safe social distancing in the queue.

You may use the main entrance or the ramp entrance. If you are able to, please use whichever entrance is less busy at the time you arrive.

Track and Trace

We will keep a record of who attends each service to help track and trace contacts in case anyone attending Church tests positive at a later date.

Social Distancing

Please enter the worship area and find a seat as quickly as possible, do not gather in groups for conversation. Some chairs will be reserved for those who are coming in families or household groups.

Please DO NOT move any seats as this will potentially compromise the way we have arranged them to allow social distancing.

Throughout your time in Church social distancing of 2 metres will be in place, keep a safe distance, just as you would in any public place at the moment. Please don't put others in an awkward situation by going over to their seats and chatting to them.

Differences to Notice

In order to minimise the risk of transmission, our Services will be much shorter than previously and will not include singing.

If you have brought your offering with you, please place it on a plate near the entrance as you arrive or leave. There will be no offering during the service.

We will not be using the Prayers of Intercession book; if you have a prayer request, please let us know by contacting a Steward Elder during the week.

At the end of the Service you will be encouraged to leave promptly rather than linger and chat, there will be no refreshments. All of this goes against what we are used to but it is to enable us to safely share in worship.

Children, Families & Households


We are looking forward to welcoming children, young people and families back to Church. Unfortunately, we won't be able to hold separate Junior Church, at least for now. We encourage children to bring their own drawing and writing materials (including pen and paper), please don't bring toys. We request parents to help children in practicing social distancing, which we realise may be demanding! Families and people from the same household or "support bubble" will be able to sit together and we will provide you with the right number of seats together for your group as long as you tell us at the time of booking.

Go Safely

As you leave Church you will be offered hand sanitiser again so that your hands are clean as you return home.

The picture for the Sixth Sunday of Easter points us towards Ascension Day when Jesus returned to his Father (celebrated this year on Thursday 13th May). The picture focuses on Jesus sending the disciples out in his name as he prepared to leave them on earth. Soon he would be sending the gift of the Holy Spirit to empower them. The words read: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you, don't question why, don't entertain doubts of whether you are up to the task...accept and believe it's true". We all feel inadequate at times, especially when given a task as challenging as going in the name of Jesus. We can be assured that God does not ask us to do anything that he doesn't also equip us for. May we all be open to the Spirit's power as we step out in faith.




In the next few days there will be some pictures on our Church railings, encouraging us all to share in Thy Kingdom Come Thy Kingdom Come is 11 special days of prayer shared by Christians around the world. It starts on Ascension Day (when we remember that the risen Jesus returned to his Father in heaven) and ends on Pentecost Sunday (when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit to the Church).

During this time our prayers are focused on God's Kingdom in the hearts of people, in the life of the Church and in the whole world. The phrase "Thy Kingdom Come" is taken from the Lord's Prayer ("Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"). In using these words we are asking that God's good purposes and plans are fulfilled in our world, just as they are in heaven. These plans include an end to conflict, war, injustice, hunger and oppression. Through prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit we can work for these things to become a reality in our world.

ECO BRICKS

It seems like a very long time ago, but do you remember the waste bin in the church porch where everyone left plastic which couldn't be recycled? It went from St James to Princes Park Methodist Church where Richard Rees used it to make eco-bricks for a project in the church garden. The following message and photos arrived from Richard this week:



"It has been 2 years since we started collecting single-use plastic and Coke bottles (thank you so much for those of you who have contributed) and at last we can see the fruits of our labour. I have attached two photos that show the completed "Raised Cross in Plastic" on the piece of waste ground behind Princes Park Methodist Church. Wildflower seeds have been scattered in the bed and I am excited about how it will look in the summer.



Approximately 100kg of plastic has been used that otherwise would have gone to land fill (or into the oceans?) and which now replaces the cross that "fell off" the front of our Church when the fixings rusted and failed. May the new cross be seen by all passing (and specially from the top deck of the double decker busses that pass frequently) and proclaim our duty as stewards of this world I am still collecting and filling

bottles with plastic for any other project other Churches might wish to consider. I hope this can inspire other projects and I would be very happy to help if needed.
