

Creative Stitches Competition is a decorative and creative embroidery competitive event. It is a State Event conducted prior to the Fall Leadership Conference. It is an *individual* event in which students embellish an existing garment. Creativity, sketching, color combinations, knowledge of the skill of embroidery, and quality of the stitches are all part of the judging process.

EVENT CATEGORIES

- Junior:** Participants in grades 6 – 8
Senior: Participants in a comprehensive program in grades 9 – 12
Occupational: Participants in an occupational program in grades 9 – 12

ELIGIBILITY

1. Participation is open to any affiliated FCCLA member. Affiliation for each participant must be submitted by November 1, 2022.
2. Each chapter may enter two (2) participants for every twelve (12) affiliated members with a maximum of six (6) entries in each event category. An event category is determined by the participant's grade in school and type of Family and Consumer Sciences program.

PROCEDURES & REGULATIONS

1. Each participant must select one of the following divisions to compete in this event:
 - A. Junior Category
 - Must embroidered an area that covers a minimum of 2 inches by 3 inches or a space that is the equivalent of that area.
 - Must use a minimum of 3 colors
 - Must demonstrate a minimum of 3 different embroidery stitches
 - These are some suggested items to embellish: pillowcase, decorative pillow cover, a back pocket of a pair of jeans, the collar of a shirt, etc.
 - B. Senior or Occupational Category
 - Must embroidered an area that covers a minimum of 5 inches by 4 inches or a space that is the equivalent of that space
 - Must use a minimum of 5 colors
 - A minimum of 5 different embroidery stitches
 - These are some suggested items to embellish: the pockets of jeans, hem area of jeans, the side seams of jeans, lapel of a jacket, etc.
3. The embroidery design and project must be created and constructed by the participant
4. Each entry will have an assigned folder to submit their project materials via Google Drive. A link to submit materials will be provided to the adviser upon competitive event registration. All entries must be submitted by **November 9, 2022**, and privacy settings must be viewable to anyone with the link.
5. The digital folder must be labeled and include the following:
 - Project Identification Document
 - Name of Participant(s)
 - School

6. Participant must include the project identification sheet in the competition folder. The Project Identification sheet must include the following information:
- A. Participant’s Name
 - B. School Name
 - C. Chapter Name
 - D. Event Name
 - E. Event Category
 - F. A brief description of the project (up to 50 words)
7. Each project must include a (digital) color sketch of the design. (on an 8.5-inch by 11-inch piece of paper.)
8. Each student must provide a storyboard on 2 pages that contains pictures that shows the competitor in the process of creating the design. The beginning stages of the project, the development of the project and the final project must be clearly presented. The final pictures must include the front and the back of the embroidery.
9. In addition, each participant will present a video not to exceed (3) three-minute explaining and demonstrating one/ two embroidery stitches their choice. Junior level is required to demonstrate and explain one (1) stitch while Senior and Occupational students must explain and demonstrate two (2) stitches. The video presentation must be uploaded to YouTube by **November 9, 2022**, with its privacy settings set to “Unlisted.” When the video is published on YouTube, it must be titled, and the description box must include:

10. The entry must include a time log for the project showing how many hours were invested each day on the project.

CREATIVE STITCHES SPECIFICATIONS

Project Evaluation

Each participant is expected to embellish an existing garment with hand done embroidery stitches. All embellishments must be fashioned by hand.

Sketch	The sketch is hand drawn in color. It is creative and the design will be enhanced by embroidery stitches.
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Use of Color	The design utilizes color in an interesting way.
Selection of Stitches	Junior level competitors must use a minimum of 3 stitches Senior & Occupational students must use a minimum of 5 stitches, Stitches are used creatively to create an attractive embellishment.
Accuracy of stitches	Great care is taken to complete the stitches with accuracy and alignment. Stitches appropriately enhance the design.
Placement of the stitches	The placement of the design is appropriate, and the stitches enhance the look of the garment. Embellishments may be used to add to the look of the project
Creativity	Interesting usage of color and texture
Quality of Finishing Details	Threads were knotted correctly, and loose threads are secured. The back of the embroidery project is clean and neat.
Degree of Difficulty	The degree of difficulty should reflect the experience, skills, and talents of the participant, with calculated risk. The participant should create a product that is challenging at his/her individual skill level.
Neat and Attractive	Final product is neat and attractive making the garment wearable art.

Digital File folder

The support materials will help the judges understand the create stitches project. The participant’s digital folder will contain the following:

Project Identification Sheet	One 8 ½” x 11” sheet of paper that includes the participant’s name, school, chapter name, event name, event category, and a brief description of the project.
Design Sketch	A color sketch of the design
Diagram of Stitches	A black and white design that diagrams the stiches used throughout the design.
Materials	List of the materials used and the fiber content where appropriate. Explain the addition of unique materials.
Storyboard	12 – 15 pictures of the of the progress of the design with pictures of the competitor creating the embellishment from beginning to end including the back of the stitches.
Video	Video demonstrating and explaining how to embroider Junior level is required to demonstrate and explain one (1) stitch while Senior and Occupational levels must explain and demonstrate two (2) stitches. The video must be clear showing the student in action displaying some close-up footage. Audio must be clear with good lighting.
Time Log	Log of the hours spent each day on the project
