

2020 SUMMER COURSE



Established by Archbishop Dr. Craig J. N. de Paulo in order to provide advance training in Old Catholic theology and related fields to American clergy and laity, the Institute for Old Catholic Theology is authorized to grant a graduate Diploma in Old Catholic Theology by the authority of the Faculty of Theology of the Collegium Augustinianum Graduate

School of Philosophy, Theology and Classics, an independent, ecumenical graduate school headquartered in Bologna and chartered in Florida.

The Institute for Old Catholic Theology offers an annual intensive summer course open to all clergy and laypeople seeking advanced study of Old Catholic theology from June 11-14, 2020, at St. Willibrord Priory in Mohnton, Pennsylvania.

The Institute focuses on Old Catholic theological methodology, patristic theology and traditional Old Catholic approaches to dogmatic theology, historical theology, moral theology, sacramentalogy, spiritual theology and ecclesiology. The esteemed Collegium Augustinianum Faculty and Fellows serve as the Institute Faculty along with



distinguished Guest Lecturers and Visiting Scholars from various universities.

The total cost of the summer course is \$1,050.00, which includes a Continental breakfast and lunch every day. Students are free for dinner and evenings. Limited Housing is also available St. Willibrord Priory at \$60.00 per day. A minimum of 50% of the course tuition is due at the time of registration and the remaining 50% is due before May 7, 2020. This may be made as a tax-deductible contribution to St. Willibrord Priory.



Housing fees for all three nights must be paid at the time of registration for reservation. OCC Members receive a discounted tuition of \$900.00.

The four-day intensive summer course includes lectures, workshops and seminars in addition to plenty of occasions for socializing and prayer. Students will have time on Saturday morning to tour historic Philadelphia and exploring beautiful Berks and

Lancaster counties.




Students are welcome to check-in at St. Willibrord's, on Thursday, June 11th, between 9am and 11am. Students flying or training into Philadelphia are expected to provide their own transportation to St. Willibrord's, which is an hour's drive from Philadelphia. The Summer Course begins at 12 Noon on Thursday, June 11th and concludes after the social and reception directly following the Sunday Celebration of the Holy Eucharist at the Priory Oratory. If Clergy would like to concelebrate at the Eucharist, they are expected to bring their own Alb and green stole. All Students are welcome to participate in daily Morning and Evening Prayer, which is sung in simple chant. The Holy Eucharist will be celebrated on Sunday morning and some evenings. During the summer course, clergy are free to dress casually, or in clerical attire, as preferred.

Participants who complete the course receive a **Graduate Diploma in Old Catholic Theology** from the Collegium Augustinianum Graduate School of Philosophy, Theology and Classics All Clergy graduates are also eligible to be Licensed for Old Catholic Ministry by the Old Catholic Confederation.

Experience Old-Eatholic Spirituality

Old-Catholic spirituality is rooted in the spirituality of the ancient Church; and thus, especially in the celebration of the Divine Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist. As Old-Catholics priory, our religious house also focuses on common prayer in the recitation of the Divine Office and especially morning and evening prayer and *Lectio Divina*. Like any orthodox Christian, as Old-Catholics, we also have a special devotion to the Theotokos, the Holy Mother of God, the angels and the saints for their intercession. Further, as Old-Catholics, we have other devotions, such as the Jesus Prayer rope, Pater Noster beads and the Marian rosary to assist us in contemplative prayer.
