Game Offers

- The game is considered assigned to you **ONLY** on confirmation from me, **NOT** at Game Offer. Offers not accepted or declined within the time limit set on the Game Offer email will be assigned to another referee



Game Offers

- **You are not authorised to pass games onto someone else without my prior approval**



Game Offers

- If you cannot make a game you are confirmed for, please email as soon as possible
- Be aware the game is **YOURS** until I confirm by email that I have received your decline



Game Offers

- **In the event of a last minute emergency (ie after 10.00am on the day of the game, and you know of a replacement who is available, you must email me the replacements name as soon as possible, with the reason you cannot do the game**



Notes For Officials

Game Sheets

- **Team sheets are to be completed PRIOR to the start of the game and are to be given to the referee before the start of the game.**



Notes For Officials

- **Pink game sheets must be exchanged PRIOR to the start of the game.**
- **EACH TEAM IS TO RECEIVE BOTH THEIR GAME SHEETS (white and yellow) BACK AT THE COMPLETION OF THE GAME.**



Notes For Officials

Bench Area

- **Everyone in the bench area must be on the game sheet, maximum 20 players dressed per game.**



Notes For Officials

Yellow and Red Cards

- **Officials are responsible for reporting cards on the back of the white game sheet.**
- ***Coaches are responsible for reporting cards to the athletic office.***



Notes For Officials

- **Players (including goal keepers) receiving a yellow card will be removed from the game until the next allowable substitution.**
- **The team will be permitted to put a substitute on the field at the time that the yellow card is given. substitution**



Notes For Officials

- **The yellow carded player is the only player who may be replaced at that time and may re-enter that game at a regular substitution.**



Notes For Officials

- **Players (including goal keepers) receiving a red card, must leave the field for the remainder of that game (no substitution allowed).**



Notes For Officials Department

- **Coaches, players and referees are expected to refrain from foul and abusive language.**



Notes For Officials

- Any coach listed on the game sheet who is dismissed during a game causes the automatic forfeiture of the game.
- Simply put, the game is over the moment the coach is dismissed.



Notes For Officials

Handshake

- Teams will shake hands under the supervision of the coach and referee **prior to the kick off** (not at the end of the game).



Notes For Officials

Forfeit

- **A game may be forfeited if a team does not arrive within 15 minutes of the starting time.**



Notes For Officials

Game Length

- **League games** will consist of two thirty-five minute halves with at least a five minute half time break.
- In the **regular season** ties will stand.



Notes For Officials

- **Playoff games** will consist of two forty minute halves with a ten minute half time break.
- In **play-off games**, extra time will consist of two ten-minute halves played in full **(NO GOLDEN GOAL)**



Notes For Officials

- **If the score is still tied after extra time, each side will take five alternating penalty shots to declare a winner.**
- **If the score is still tied after 5 penalty shots from both teams, a series of sudden-death alternating penalty shots will be taken (different 5 go through entire team)... ie: as per FIFA rules**



Notes For Officials

- note: in the case of a double header, the first game **must** start on time or the halves are to be shortened to ensure the 2nd game starts on time



Game Length

- If game is to be shortened, allow for 10 minutes at the end of the first game to do the paperwork... ie scheduled KO is 2.30pm, but you start at 2.45pm, game must be finished by 3.50pm so the next game can start at 4.00pm.
- Therefore game will be reduced 2 x 30 minutes, with five minutes for halftime



Notes For Officials

The Field

- **The soccer field at every school that is the closest to F.I.F.A. regulations, with regards to field size and soccer goal dimensions, will be used for all regular season and play-off home games.**



Notes For Officials

- **Markings must include 6 yard box, 18 yard box, half line, center circle; corner flags and nets must be used.**
- **Home teams to provide a game ball.**



Notes For Officials

AR's for League Games

- **Each team is responsible for providing a linesperson for the entire duration of all games. Lines people may be team players awaiting substitution provided their team shirts are not visible. Lines people are to be used for purposes of calling out of bounds only (note – should a school change a linesperson during the game you are to be notified of the change).**



Notes For Officials

Uniforms

- Teams must wear similar coloured jerseys numbered on the back. The entire team must dress in **IDENTICAL** colored shorts and **IDENTICAL** colored socks. Shorts may not be cutoffs.
- Pants may be worn for religious reasons.



Notes For Officials

- **It is the responsibility of the visiting team to avoid conflicting colours.**



Notes For Officials

- **Jewelry may not be worn by participating players.**
- **Shin guards must be worn by participating players.**



Notes For Officials

- **Coaches may inspect the opposing teams footgear and refer players to the referee for a final decision.**
- **Head gear worn for religious reasons is allowed.**



Notes For Officials

Substitutions

- **At goal kicks, after a goal has been scored, at the time of injury (injured player only), at half time, and on your own throw-ins only (there is to be no 'piggy backing').**



Notes For Officials

Rainy Day Procedure

- **all games should be played as scheduled.**



Notes For Officials

- **If it is the first game of a double header, the game should be abandoned as soon as suspended time reaches 15 minutes.**
- **The second game must start on time if possible**



Notes For Officials

- Only exceptions are:
- Badly waterlogged field
- Deep rutted frozen field
- Lightning
- In the event of lightning, game is to be suspended to see if the storm passes over.



Notes For Officials

- **If it is the second game of a double header, the start may be suspended for no more than 30 minutes, and the game time reduced with agreement of the Home and Away coaches.**
- **If the game is started, the game should be abandoned as soon as suspended time reaches 15 minutes.**



Notes For Officials

Rainy Day Procedure

- **Officials and coaches can agree to a shortened game should weather be threatening, but 2 equal halves must be played.**



Notes For Officials

- **Home teams are responsible for paying officials (most payment will be by cheque, periodically payment will be made in cash).**



Notes For Officials

- Regular season rate **\$55.00** referee.
- Playoff rate **\$55.00** referee, **\$40.00** assistant.
- Referees for Senior Tier 1 games will be paid **\$60.00**



Notes For Officials

- hot weather – add water breaks
- no spectators behind net area
- concerns with coaches and/or teams to be reported to richcarman@rogers.com and laura.mcgill@peelsb.com



Notes For Officials

- incidents involving violent conduct, abusive or insulting language towards the official, and spitting are to be reported to richcarman@rogers.com and laura.mcgil@peelsb.com
- The report to include a description of the incident.



Game Day - Pregame

- **Arrive at the field at least 20 minutes before kick off**
- **Do a quick field inspection**
- **Introduce yourself to the coaches and obtain the 3-part game sheets**
- **Receive game fee from the Home Coach**



Game Day - Pregame

- **Only coaching staff and players are allowed in the bench area and all must be on the game sheet**
- **Maximum 20 players dressed per game**



Game Day - Pregame

- **Give the Home coach the pink copy of the Away team sheet and the Away coach the pink copy of the Home team sheet**



Game Day - Pregame

- Teams will shake hands under the supervision of the coach and referee **prior to the kick off (not at the end of the game).**
- **Coin Toss**



Game Length

- **League games** will consist of two thirty-five minute halves with at least a five minute half time break.
- **Playoff games** will consist of two forty minute halves with a ten minute half time break.



Post Game

- **Fill out the Front side of the Home white game sheet**
- **Fill out the reverse side of Home white game sheet with details of Home red and yellow cards**



Post Game

- Fill out the Front side of the Away white game sheet
- Fill out the reverse side of the Away white game sheet with details of Away red and yellow cards



Post Game

- Hand the completed Home white and yellow game sheets to the Home Coach
- Hand the completed Away white and yellow game sheets to the Away Coach



When You Get Home

- If you have issued red card, send an email **BY 9.00am THE DAY FOLLOWING DAY THE GAME** to richcarman@rogers.com detailing what happened for each card
- If you have dismissed a coach, or are reporting poor behaviour by a coach, send an email **BY 9.00am THE DAY FOLLOWING DAY THE GAME** to richcarman@rogers.com detailing what happened



Example Email

- **Red Card Report.**
- **Mississauga v Brampton**
- **Played at Hershey #1 on April 15, 2018**
- **At 15 minutes of the first half of, Brampton #15 slide tackled a Mississauga player with little or no respect for the Mississauga players safety. Brampton #15 was dismissed for Violent Conduct.**



Example Email

- **Discipline Report.**
- **Mississauga v Brampton**
- **Played at Hershey #1 on April 15, 2018**
- **At 30 minutes of the second half, Brampton Coach, Willy Never took umbrage to the denial of a penalty for his team, and shouted loudly that I was a fucking crap referee and needed glasses.**



Example Email

- **I approached the coach and asked him to calm down. I reminded him of the consequences if he persisted with his action.**
- **The coach was calmed down by his assistant, and caused no further problems during the game or after.**



Example Email

- I approached the coach and asked him to calm down. I reminded him of the consequences if he he persisted with his action.
- The coach refused to calm down, and continued his rant at me, saying I was fucking blind, should have my ref license taken away, and more.
- I informed the coach he was being dismissed, and then abandoned the game.
