Reflections of Rally Trial, October 23, 2016 by Nanci Hayes, Rally Judge

The Lakes Region of New Hampshire held 2 Rally trials in one day with 46 dogs entered in the morning and 41 dogs in the afternoon trial. I was smiling from ear-to-ear, from start to finish, mainly because the spots were out in full force. The only breed outnumbering the 6 Dalmatians were the Australian Shepherds with 9 entered in the morning trial and 7 in the afternoon trial. That means there were more Dalmatians than Labrador Retrievers, Golden Retrievers and Border Collies, which NEVER happens in an all-breed trial. Each of the Dalmatians were GREAT ambassadors for the breed showing how well Dalmatians can compete. The icing on the cake was that I was having flashbacks holding Melissa MacWilliams' Monson and Sara Eastman's Thriller as young puppies before they went to their forever homes. I had tears in my eyes thinking about how far these puppies had come. Christine Ramalho was in Rally Novice with Baker and had a stellar performance. Dawn's Lollipop and Zen have a bond that many an experienced handler would die for. I was ecstatic. We have a phenomenal breed and these dogs and handlers deserve huge congratulations for a job well done. I have never been as emotional judging as well as more proud of the exhibitors than at this trial. The DCSNE should be very proud of these teams.

Barbara & Ed Barrett, Planett Dalmatians

How quickly 35 years goes by! Some may not realize that we began our involvement with Dalmatians while we were living in New England. While Ed was in grad school at the University of Maine, Barbara got the idea of showing a dog to keep occupied. She pitched different breeds to Ed who kept saying “no”. One day she brought up Dalmatians, and before he could catch himself, he said “OK,” but added; “Just don’t ever expect me to show them”. We purchased our foundation bitch, CH Erin’s Amazing Grace (Gracie) and that was the beginning of what would soon be Planett Dalmatians. Planett was formed by the last four letters of Barbara’s maiden name (Kaplan) and the last three of Ed’s last name (Barrett) – it is not a misspelling.

After returning to New Jersey, we bred our first litter in 1985, which produced CH Planett’s Morningstar of Erin (Esther). Barbara finished Esther by going BOW at the DCGNY Specialty over 64 dogs and bitches, back in the day when entries were large. We bred infrequently through the 90’s (our focus was on our daughter, Allison), producing 8 champions, including Esther’s daughters, Ch. Planett’s Lucy in the Sky (Lucy) and Ch. Planett’s Star Kissed, (Maizy). When Barbara hurt her knee, Ed begrudgingly took Lucy into the show ring to try to get her second major. After multiple lackluster performances, Ed went BOB with Lucy over specials to finish her. He was hooked. Nonetheless, we showed mostly regionally through the 90’s. Lucy’s daughter, Ch. Planett’s Northern Star (Nora) brought us into the new millennium. Our brood bitches tend to be very pre-potent. And with only one exception, our lines have been continued through only one bitch per generation, to what is now Planett Dalmatians’ 8th generation.

In 2002, we expanded our horizons by breeding Lucy to CH Tuckaway Augusta producing CH Planett’s Northern Star (Nora). Nora then produced Savannah (CH Planett’s Tupelo Honey) who has been the embodiment of Planett breed type. (as of this writing, Savannah is 10 days short of her 15th birthday). This breeding also produced Winnie (CH Planett’s Winter Solstice) and began the first of three spousal competitions between Barbara and Ed, to finish littermates. From this point, we began to truly hit our stride.

Savannah produced five champion get, including the star of our next generation, MBISS GCH Planett's Third Rock from the Sun (Roxy). Roxy finished her championship by going BOB from the classes at the 2007 DCSNE specialty, over 14 specials, and then going on to a Group 3. She then went BOB at another specialty when shown as a special very limitedly. Roxy brought us even further, and pretty much into the present by producing 7 champions when bred to GCH Monarch N Canalside's Monarch (Garth). These champion get include MBISS GCHG Planett's Star Reporter (Brinkley), BIS BISS GCHS. Planett's N Shamrock's Don't Think Twice (Jake) and GCHS. Planett's Ancient Mariner (Bosun). All three have qualified for the Top 20 for 2017.

Brinkley brought us to the pinnacle by winning BOB at the 2014 DCA National. He also won 10 additional Regional specialty BOB's, multiple Group 1's, three Westminster AOM's, and finished his championship. Our breeding program has been focused and deliberate. Breed type, health, and movement are paramount. Our temperaments have been superb. We are firm believers in attaining health clearances towards improving the breed. One of the biggest compliments we have ever received is that our dogs are always identifiable because our type is so true. These 35 years have been remarkable. We have made so many show friends along the way who have enriched our lives. We have also made many families happy with our pups, some who have gone on to get obedience, rally and other titles. We have witnessed such a stretch of Dalmatian history (including having Barbara Partridge briefly show one of our first dogs). And then there are the dogs. Times have been thrilling as well as heartbreaking. The biggest heartbreak has been losing Brinkley at the age of 5 to an acute immune mediated disease that is not hereditary. Being "in dogs" has been a true labor of love. And as we prepare to bring out Willa and Sally, the first representatives of our 8th generation, we are still every bit as excited and grateful to be in the dog world. We are also grateful to those who have dogs that we have bred and have shown them, are showing them or are specializing them. It's a breeders' dream. At this point we have 23 home bred champions. Thank you, DCSNE, for the honor of printing our story.



DCSNE Obedience Clinic March 5, 2017



What a year 2016 was for the Garceau's spotted dogs!!!

Huck finished 2016 with his CA title and began 2017 with a group one.


Monson received his first qualifying weight pull on snow pulling 200 lbs on March 2 . This is a UKC event .


