

As you notice as man heard the voice of the Lord God walking in the garden; they hid.

Vs. 9 - 11 [The Conversation of the fall between God & Man | Woman]

As you noticed, God addressed Adam because it was Adam he gave the command not to eat of the tree in the midst of the garden

When he called Adam, his response to God revealed his disobedience immediately. Vs. 11 God asked him who informed him of his nakedness and followed the question with a response of whether or not he had eaten from the forbidden tree.

Vs. 12 [Adam’s response to God’s Question]  
Adam blamed God and the Woman He gave him.

Vs. 13. [God ask the Woman what she had done]  
The woman respond by blaming the serpent

These actions committed by Adam and his wife caused a tarnished relationship between them and God. Now, Although God is loving and merciful because He is also “just” in all His ways, He punished Adam and his wife to a spiritual death of separation from Him

My Study Bible states: Adam and Eve learned by painful experiences that because God is holy and hates sin, He must punish sinners. The rest of the book of Genesis recounts painful stories of lives ruined as a result of the Fall. Disobedience is sin, and it breaks our fellowship with God. But fortunately, God is willing to forgive us and to restore our relationship with him when we admit our sin.

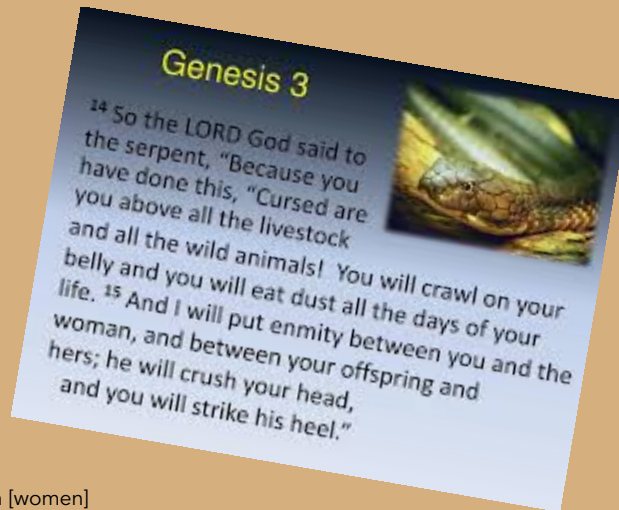



My NIV Study Bible concludes the following meaning to this verse: Satan is our enemy. He will do anything he can to get us to follow his evil, deadly path. The phrase "you will strike his heel" refers to Satan's repeated attempts to defeat Christ during his life on earth. "He will crush your head" foreshadows Satan's defeat at Christ's resurrection. A blow to the heel is not deadly, but a blow to the head is. Even in the Garden God was revealing his plan to defeat Satan and offer salvation to the world through his Son, Jesus Christ.

You may go to vs. 20 in your bible and you will see that Adam then named his wife Eve

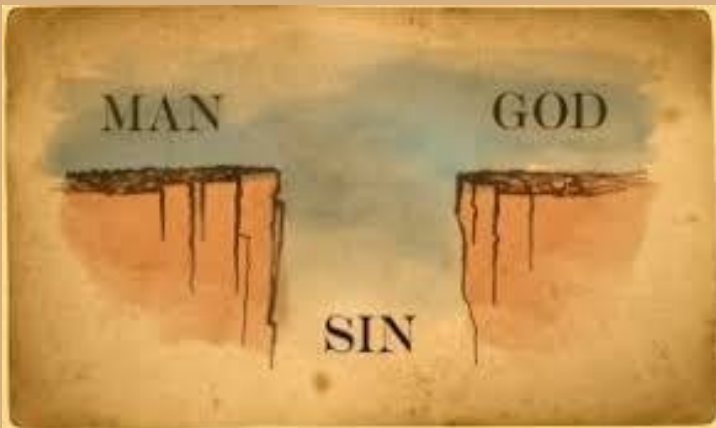
We see in the text that God clothed Adam and his wife in Vs. 21.
