

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# Ado's Air Spray.

Welcome to the August edition of the Ipswich Branch of the Ulysses Club. I read with interest in the Ulysses Community newsfeed of branches who have informed our National Committee that they are on a recruiting drive. We at the Ipswich Branch have our own personal recruiter with Gronk introducing himself, his long lost brother Tom, and 5 other potential members in Captain Ahab, Smurfette, Sue and Roy and his partner. He is aiming at 7 for this year. By my count that is already seven. Well done Matey. I was indisposed the other Sunday and Chopper, Splitty and Windsucker volunteered to attend the Sth East Qld President's Meeting at Harrisville. 

## Some more from Erik and Anni's Vietnam Adventure

### **Monday**

We were recommented to wear wet weather gear right from the start of the day as the weather didn't look too promissing and it wasn't very warm either so we took the advise and wore it.

As per usual, we had some very good views of mountains and rice fields however, as we climbed up in the beautiful mountains, they didn't look so beautiful any longer as the rain increased and we couldn't see much.

We pulled in at a café and had some coffee. We were hoping we could wait the rain out, but it didn't seem to end anytime soon so eventually we had to go again.

We came to a very barren and poor area. It was cold and rainy and the soil didn't look too good. We were told that people here didn't get very old as they had to work very hard to survive. The women got married off in a very young age (12-14 years) and then they had to work very hard and often got abused by their husbond and therefore they had a high suicide rate amongst women in that area.

As we went through a small village, we saw a bloke, totally legless drunk trying to cross the road, or at least it looked like he was going to, but he couldn't really steer himself in any

direction. We narrowly missed him as we drove past him and we were happy that nothing bad happened when we were there.

A few km's out of that village, we stopped at an even smaller village, or more like a cluster of houses. The guide took us for a walk arround the houses. There was a house that looked like someone was home so we knocked on the door. Out came a woman and 4 very shy kids. She told us that the kids was her grandkids and she was looking after



them as the parents we out working. They didn't have much clothes on compaire to us so they must have been freezing. The house didn't look all that warm either as the walls didn't reach the roof and one side of the house had just a wall acting as a fence.

After talking for about 10 minutes, the kids found out that we didn't come to hurt them so began to be cheeky.

We handed over some money and said goodbye and thanks for the look and then we were on our way in the rain.

We pulled in at hotel this time in a town located up high above sea level and it was cold so we didn't mind getting off the bike and have a nice warm shower.

### **Tuesday**

The weather was better, but we still had to wear our wet weather gear. It didn't really rain. It was just a light drizzle or heavy fog. Unfortunately the fog prevented us enjoying the view.

After a while, we went on lower ground and the temperature went up and eventually we had to stop and get rid of our rain gear. This was so much better.



We just happened to stop in a small village where there was some activities going on in their community house. We all went in there to see what they were up to. There was a lot of kids there and in a dark room, some women were boiling corn as to make some sort of alcohol. She was fishing all the boiled corn out and left it in a pile on the concrete floor. They were going to feed their pigs with the de-alcoholized corn.

All the kids were outside and were very interested in us white people. Some old man came over and pulled the beard on all the bearded people. He was laughing at us as it is not normal in Vietnam to have any facial hair. He also had a go at my moustache and shook his head and laughed.

That night, we stayed at a hotel in another mountain town. When we arrived, we had time to go for a walk and thay had a market where they sold a lot of strange things, like cow faces and dog meat.

There was a lot of life on the street during the day but when it got dark, everything was shut and I didn't feel safe, walking down the street so we made it a short walk and quickly back to the hotel. Every entrance and driveways was shut with big heavy steel gates. Obvious there was a

problem in this town and I just had to ask our Vietnamese guide what the problem was. He wouldn't answer that one. He said that it could be laws passed by the local council about security but I didn't buy that one.

# Wednesday

He weather was good and we took off for another adventures day, pretty much like the other days with lots of bad roads and stunning views and a bit of rain as well. After the usual routine, coffee break, lunch break, coffee break, ve went into Ba Be national park where we were to spend 2 nights. We needed a break from the bikes as it was sometimes very intens, dodging pot holes and big boulders on the road not to mention trucks and millions of small motorbikes. We were staying at a homestay but this time Anni and I got a room to ourselves

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# Bikes to return to Bathurst as new dedicated racetrack takes a major step forward

The Bathurst Regional Council has awarded the contract for the design of a second, permanent circuit at Mt Panorama budgeted to cost at least \$52 million.

British company Apex Circuit Design has been given 84 weeks to create a design that meets the approval of the world governing car and motorcycle racing bodies, the FIA and





Bathurst mayor Graeme Hanger says it will be at least three years — perhaps longer — before there is racing on the new circuit, to be known as Velocity Park.

"This is the start of bringing this vision — the vision to build on Bathurst's reputation for staging world-class international motorsport events and take it to the next level – to reality," Hanger said.

The proposed 4.58km circuit is south of the 6.213km Mount Panorama course on public roads used for the Bathurst 1000, 12-Hour and Six-Hour.

The new track will be to the west of McPhillamy Park and Reid Park in the existing circuit.

The NSW government has already committed \$15 million to the project and the federal government \$10 million towards the construction of the new track and lobbying will now intensify for bigger contributions, while the council undoubtedly will have to contribute itself.

Apex will be paid \$3.7 million for the design of the venue, expected to have a capacity of 50,000 spectators.

It beat Gold Coast-based Integrated Event Delivery Management (iEDM) and Italian company Dromo in the tender.

Apex designed Dubai's elaborate autodrome and more recently the Zhejiang circuit in China and a circuit for Keysbrook in WA, as well as upgrades to Sydney Motorsport Park and New Zealand's Hampton Downs. It is also working on a new track in Thailand and upgrade to Mexico City's GP track.

"The company has designed and delivered some of the best motor sports tracks around the world," Hanger said.

"Bringing Apex on board with this project allows us to get this design right, to make the second circuit a world-renowned facility, as iconic in the world of motorsports as the existing Mount Panorama circuit."

While the progress is being closely followed by Australia's car racing categories, especially Supercars, a spokesman for the Velocity Park project, Lachlan Sullivan, said it would also realise "a long-established goal to bring back motorcycle racing to Bathurst".

### CRASH'S MONTHLY MOTORCYLE TIPS

Greetings fellow branch members, this month we'll look at riding in the rain.

First of all it's always good to have some wet weather gear, remember to allow for the fact that it will have to fit over your riding gear.

It's nice to have traction control and ABS, but not all of us have that on our

bikes, just the same some of the following tips are still important.

If you get caught in a storm or it simply starts raining, try and pull over to a safe place or ride with caution as the first fifteen minutes are the most dangerous, as that is usually how long it will take for the rain to wash any oil or slippery substances off the road surface.

Also try and double you following distance if possible, keep clear of painted lines such as zebra crossings, painted arrows etc.

If possible wear hi vis gear as it is much harder for motorists to see motorcycles in the rain.

Try and ride in car tracks in the road as they might be drier than other parts of the road.

That's all this month from someone who knows how to crash.

NOT indicating when entering and leaving a roundabout, keeping left in speed zones above 80km/h and when to use high beams have been named in a list of the most commonly misunderstood road rules.

The Queensland Police Service has released a driver refresher on road rules that drivers are either unaware of or aren't following correctly.

The list includes;

**U-Turns at traffic lights** - this is one of the most asked questions when we are out and about and many drivers have had a frustrating or dangerous experience when entering a controlled intersection. You can only preform a U-Turn at a traffic light 'only' if there is an authorised sign stating U-Turn Permitted.

**Roundabouts** - Drivers approaching a roundabout must use their indicators when entering and turning left, right or making a U-turn, but not when travelling straight ahead When exiting a roundabout, whether you are turning left, right or even going straight ahead, you must always indicate left just before you exit, unless it is not practical.

**Giving way to pedestrians** - If a driver is turning left or right at an intersection, he or she must give way to any pedestrian crossing the road the driver is entering. This applies to intersections with and without traffic lights.

**Mobile phones** - A mobile phone can only be used while driving in Queensland if a hands-free device is in use, and you are not a learner or P1 licence holder. Driving with a mobile phone in the driver's hand is illegal. This includes, but is not limited to, making and receiving calls and any other function of the phone, including GPS or playing music. However, even if you are using your phone hands free, if you drive erratically or are obviously distracted from the driving task, you may be fined as other rules may apply like driving without due care and attention.

**Merging** - When a driver changes lanes, crossing a dotted line separating the lanes, they must give way to the traffic travelling in the lane they are entering. This rule applies regardless of whether the lane is ending or not. When two lines of traffic, travelling in the same direction merge, but no line is crossed a driver must give way to the vehicle ahead.

**Keeping left** - On roads with a speed limit of more than 80km/h, motorists must not drive in the right-hand lane unless overtaking, turning right or making a U-turn, avoiding an obstacle or driving in congested traffic. If a 'Keep Left Unless Overtaking' sign is displayed, then you must keep left on these roads regardless of the speed limit.

**Headlight and fog light use** - High beam is not permitted if travelling less than 200 metres behind a car going in the same direction or less than 200 metres from an oncoming vehicle. This includes flashing your headlights. A driver is only permitted to use fog lights if driving in fog, mist or other atmospheric condition that restricts visibility.

**U-Turns** - When making a U-turn, a driver must have a clear view of any approaching traffic and give way to all vehicles and pedestrians. Drivers are not allowed to make a U-turn across: a) a single continuous dividing line; b) a single continuous dividing line to the left of a broken line; c) two parallel continuous dividing lines.

**School zones** - A school zone is the signed area around a school with a speed limit of 40km/h normally from 7am-9am and 2pm-4pm on school days. Details on Queensland gazetted school days can be located here. There are a small number of non-standard school zone times in Queensland. Signs at these schools display the times which apply.

**Yellow traffic lights** - A driver approaching traffic lights showing a yellow traffic light must stop if they can do so safely. Penalties apply for drivers who fail to do so







