
Our next meeting is on October 20. Hope you can join us, as it will be an in-person meeting only. This will be a very important meeting, as we will be voting for our new board.



SIZES OF QUILTS FOR THE ELDERLY AND LINUS

If you are making quilts for charity, please remember how they will be used and the size most appropriate. Most of the adult quilts will be used across the resident's legs while in a wheelchair or sitting in their room. They might also be used to lie under for a nap. Therefore, the best size is about 40-42" wide and about 50-55" long. We usually also need a few patriotic themed quilts for our veterans in these facilities.

The quilts we make for Texas Children's Hospital through the Linus program have a wide range of sizes needed. Texas Children's takes kids from preemie size to age 21. Smaller quilts for younger kids, but also needed are longer ones for teenage boys and girls.
