Keep warm, keep dry, and Quilt On!

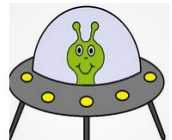

Start looking through your closets for those UFO's! We look forward to helping you get your UFO's done!

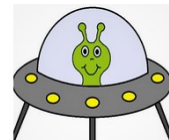

Peninsula Piecemakers Quilt Guild 2023 UFO Participation Information



Do you need motivation to complete those UFO's (UnFinished Objects) taking over your sewing space? Then this activity is for you! The cost is only \$2 to participate!

Pick five (5) of your UFO's you want to complete in 2023. Every other month, beginning in April, YOU will bring in one of your completed UFO's listed on your participation form, have it checked off by the UFO Alienettes (Sandy and Natalie), then display it during the UFO Show 'n Tell. If you bring the completed quilt or garment to be checked off and show it at UFO Show 'n Tell (in April, June, August, October, or December meeting), your name will be entered in a drawing at that meeting AND a grand prize drawing at the December 2023 final meeting. If you bring your UFO to both meetings in the specified month, your name is entered only once but you can show it at both UFO Show 'n Tells. Even if you don't win a prize, think of what a winner you will be to have those UFO's finally completed.

FAQ's

How can I participate?

Answer: Complete two 2023 UFO Participation forms and return one at the February/March meetings. Keep the second copy for your records. For each UFO, write the name of the quilt or garment and a fairly detailed description of each item (colors, pattern, approximate size, etc.) and what needs to be done to complete each item (add borders, sandwich and quilt, or sew on a label, etc.).

What if I don't have five (5) UFO's?

Answer: Write down as many as you have.

Can I substitute one UFO for another?

Answer: YES, another one from your UFO list can be substituted.

What if I cannot come to the meeting to show my project?

Answer: The quilt or garment MUST be shown in April, June, August, October or December 2023. If you cannot be there, find someone to show it for you, to not miss out on a possible prize drawing.

How do I know if my UFO is complete?

Answer: A completed project means no additional work is needed to display, use, or wear the item.

On the day the completed UFO is due, what must I do?

Answer: Bring the completed project to the UFO table at the Day or Night Chapter meeting; get checked off; your name will then be put in for both drawings (monthly and grand prize); have project shown at UFO Show 'n Tell.

We hope you will join us in this activity for 2023.

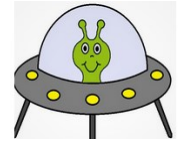

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Treasurer's Report - Natalie Hutchinson presented our 2023 budget to the members. Note that the 2022 budget does not include a payment for Zoom because we terminated our membership. Sandy Barnes reminded the membership that it was important to read the treasurer's report when it is in our Newsletter. Night members voted on the 2023 budget, one member abstained, everyone else approved the budget.

Nominating Committee – Linda Odell - We have eight positions open on the board. There are a lot of volunteer positions open, these positions serve from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31. Please read the Newsletter and consider taking a Board or Volunteer position when you are asked. Nominating Committee Linda Odell, Rita Crawford, Ingrid Kross and Donna Dooley.

Raffle Quilt 2023 – Debi Cross – The new raffle quilt was displayed; “Fiesta”, 95x95, the drawing will be the day meeting Nov. 2023. Raffle tickets are available for purchase. Volunteers are needed for a 2-hour shift to white glove at the Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival Feb 23-26 and to work at the raffle table. Members that designed, sewed and quilted this quilt are: Debi Cross, Jeanne Surber, Denise Vassar, Gina Vivian, Trina Murray and Lori Murdock who also long armed the quilt. Thank you, ladies.

Night Program February 14 meeting – Lisa Hartman – “Galentine/Palentine” evening. We will be tying strips of fabric on a wire heart shaped wreath. Wire wreath provided by the guild. Members that want to participate should bring 125 (1 ½ X 9 inch) pieces of fabric (perhaps use red/pink/white). The sample was made with Valentine fabric, but bring any colors of your choice. There will be a few kits for members that do not have fabric. Members are invited to bring cookies to share. There will be games and prizes.

BOM (Night) – Gina Vivian displayed our 2023 BOM. The first block pattern was distributed at this meeting. Cost is \$10 for the entire pattern/year. Bring the completed block to display (or email a photo to Gina) by/at the next meeting to have your name in a drawing for a gift card.
