Remembrance Day

Here is the tragedy: some 60,000 died and around 156,000 were wounded or taken prisoner.

Tyabb Township Plan/Airfield Precinct Plan

Tyabb Airfield Community Reference Group

The Tyabb Airfield Community Reference Group (CRG) met for the second time on 1st August, 2018. Key matters covered in the meeting included:


- a. All those present endorsed the CRG's Terms of Reference (ToR) and Group Guidelines to indicate their understanding of, and agreement to these. (A copy of the final ToR and Guidelines are available at: http://www.mornpen.vic.gov.au/Building-Planning/Strategic-Planning/Tyabb-Airfield-Precinct Plan. The document provides for further review of the ToR by the Chair in consultation with the CRG at any time to facilitate the effective operation of the group).
- b. It was agreed that a key purpose of the CRG is to support the preparation of an Airfield Master Plan (which is being developed by the Peninsula Aero Club - PAC) and concurrent Aircraft Noise Management Plan. In turn, the purpose of the Airfield Master Plan is intended to provide certainty and clarity to the community about the future of the airfield.
- c. The PAC confirmed its ongoing commitment to producing the Airfield Master Plan. It was agreed that the PAC will firstly engage with the Shire on the proposed content of the Plan, to test it through the Officers, and will then bring the draft to the CRG for comment and discussion. The Plan will then be submitted to the Shire for the final approval process, including an opportunity for public comment. An approved Plan can then form the basis for assessment of future planning applications and can support changes to the planning scheme as foreshadowed in the Tyabb Airfield Precinct Plan.
- d. The PAC invited all other members of the CRG to provide a list of concerns/issues in relation to the operation of the airfield, as well as any suggestions for improvement, and

- indicated it would be preferable if such advice was provided to the PAC as soon as possible to assist preparation of the draft Airfield Master Plan.
- e. The CRG discussed the noise assessment work needed to prepare an Aircraft Noise Management Plan, which is to be produced concurrently with the Airfield Master Plan. Council is committed to funding the noise assessment work to ensure the independence of the study and will also consult Airservices Australia to ensure the technical validity of the findings. The PAC has indicated that a better understanding of the noise 'footprint' of the airfield would enable consideration of adjustments to flight paths to minimise impacts.
- f. The CRG discussed questions and concerns relating to a PAC proposal to widen the sealed section of the existing N-S runway. There was agreement to collaborate on finalising 'Frequently Asked Questions' (FAQs) on this topic to inform the wider community. It was also agreed the Ratepayers, PAC and Shire would publish the FAQs on their websites once completed. Additional FAQs are also to be considered.

Open Air Burning October 2018

Removal of some restrictions on Open Air Burning for October 2018

Mornington Peninsula Shire's Open Air Burning Local Law regulates burning off outside of the Declared Fire Danger Period.

In accordance with Clause 56 of the General Purposes Local Law 2012 – Part 7 Open Air Burning, Incinerators and Chimneys, notice is hereby given that for the month of October 2018 the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer has removed some restrictions on Open Air Burning to enable landowners to light a fire in the open air for fire prevention purposes.

The changes to the Open Air Burning Local Law for October 2018 removes the previous land size restrictions that prohibited Open Air Burning on land less than 1,500 square metres without a permit from Council.

Open Air Burning is permitted on Fridays and Saturdays between the hours of 9am and 4pm on land less than 1,500 square metres provided that:


- No more than 1 cubic metre of vegetation is burnt at any one time,
- The fire is not within 10 metres of any neighbouring dwelling, and
- The General Fire Safety Provisions are followed at all times.

Current Open Air Burning regulations for land above 1,500 square metres and land above 40,000 square metres remain the same.

The removal of Open Air Burning restrictions on land of less than 1,500 square metres will come into effect on 1 October 2018 and expire on 31 October 2018.



With extraction gearing up again the damage from large trucks and trailers entering Jones Road and crossing the centre line has returned. Please take extra care on this stretch of Jones Road between Vista Court & Soderlund Place.

VCAT

An application by a local resident challenging the claim of existing use rights by Bayport Industries to operate the Quarry was held in VCAT last month. From the evidence submitted there were many years where the owners did not submit records of extraction to the department as required under the terms of their Work Authority.

We await the referee's decision and hope for fair, efficient justice for all.

Tyabb Township Plan

The Tyabb Township Plan of 2012/13 was followed up by a \$50,000 Mornington Peninsula Shire Place-making allocation. Many meetings and walk-arounds happened at that time with Shire Officers and Tyabb Rate-payer representatives and plans developed. The walk way/running track around Central Reserve, additional picnic bench and table, drinking fountains (with dog bowls) and clean up of planted areas took place but the grant soon ran out so the planter boxes and the like were never installed. Somerville Tyabb Rotary Club built the BBQ shelter alongside the playground area at this time.

Over the last nine months discussions and emails with our Watson Ward Councillor Julie Morris and Shire Officers over where we are at have been happening, culminating in a walk-round and discussion on the 3rd September 2018 with our Councillor and Officers. The main topics were centred around parking and safety. Parking on the pavement outside the Cellarbrations Bottle Shop has become a major safety issue so it was agreed to renew the existing bollards and put more in to stop this happening. The Central Oval has had an upgrade of use since the original Town Plan was done due to the increasing uptake in sport (especially by girls) putting great demands on all the Shire sports areas; this increased the safety requirement for fencing along Frankston Flinders Road (just completed). It was identified that if the parking signs were better placed, off street parking would be better used especially with improved access and in particular improved lighting. (The Shire is changing the street lights all over the Mornington Peninsula to LEDs, not only reducing power costs but giving better coverage). The heritage Guide Hall in The Crescent will be fixed up properly, long over due, and the Shire is having many conversations with Vic Rail about the 'pathway' to Railway Parade and the unsafe crossing area of the track opposite the Padua traffic lights.

A future subject for major consultation and planning is the heritage trees in the Central Reserve as they are getting very close to their "use-by date", especially with vehicles driving over their root areas. What are they going to be replaced with — watch this space.
