Spirituality Corner

We recently celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16th.

The Blessed Mother appeared at Mount Carmel to St. Simon Stock. Most notable about Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the institution of the scapular.

On July 16, 1251, St. Simon, a priest in the Carmelite religious order, was on his way to the Holy Land. The group decided to stop to pray on Mount Carmel. It was during that prayer that Mary appeared to St. Simon. She appeared holding Jesus as a child in one arm.

On her other arm, she held a scapular. This is a long piece of sleeveless cloth worn by Carmelites in the Carmelite religious order. She promised that all those who wear this cloth and follow Christ faithfully will be brought by Our Lady into heaven at their deaths.

The lay scapular consists of a necklace-like cord that is worn around the neck, with a badge on each end resting on one's chest and back. The badges contain brown wool similar to the Carmelite habit. The wearer agrees to live a faithful life and pray the Rosary. In return, he or she receives the grace of being ushered into heaven by Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

In order to be eligible for the scapular promise, one must be enrolled in the Brown Scapular Confraternity. This is a simple ceremony which can be performed by any priest. The members of the Confraternity have the added benefit of sharing in all the spiritual benefits of the Carmelite Order.

The scapular must be 100% wool without plastic casing and should not be pinned or affixed to clothing. It is worn over the head, under one's clothes, with one square of wool hanging on the chest and the other on the back.
