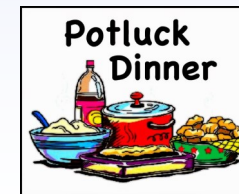

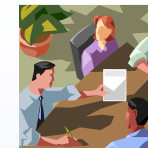

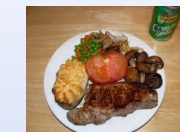

 Choir practice is on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 – 8:30. We are thoroughly enjoying preparing for the Advent and Christmas seasons!

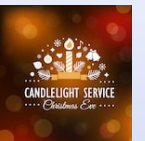
**JUBILEE CIRCLE**

## THE MINISTER'S MUSINGS...

Dear Friends,

The season of Advent has arrived! We now begin the season of watching and waiting for the arrival of the King of kings and Lord of lords.

In case you didn't know, the word "advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus" which means "coming." This is the season during which we wait for the coming of our Lord into the world. This may seem kind of strange since Jesus has already come into the world. So, what is it we are actually waiting for?

This is a time we prepare our minds and hearts to remember and celebrate the birth of our Lord. But equally important (if not more so), this is the season we focus on the second coming of our Lord. That is the advent – the coming – we await.

The prescribed scripture readings for this season remind us that Jesus will come again. And when he does, he has promised there will be no more sorrow or pain or death, no more war or disease or poverty. He has said that all things in heaven and earth will be made one.

This is a hope and dream many long for – right now! With so much turmoil in the world and in personal lives, I keep hearing people say, "I wish Jesus would hurry up and get back here!" Honestly, I've thought that myself.

At the same time, it is not easy to focus on his second coming when the world is decorating, shopping, rushing to cram in glad tidings in preparation for the celebration of his first coming – that is, Christmas.

Yes, remembering the birth of a tiny baby centuries ago, born to bring salvation to humankind, is a tremendous reason to celebrate. It touches our hearts on so many different levels. But remember to reflect on what it means to you as you think about what the return of our risen Lord will bring.

Let me encourage you to change your focus for a day or two, this Advent season. Turn your attention to what it means for you that the Christ Jesus will come again; this time, not as a baby, but as our risen Lord who says, "Surely I am coming soon.' Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20 NRSV)

## LIVING NATIVITY 2019

About two-thousand years ago, a young couple named Mary and Joseph — the lady being "great with child," we are reliably informed — made a spiritual journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

The world hasn't stopped talking about what happened next ever since.

Since 2010, members of our two congregations have invited their friends and neighbors to take a spiritual "Journey to Bethlehem" of their own, following a candlelit path that winds through the Laurel Hill church's spacious grounds.

This year's Living Nativity runs continuously from 5:30 to 8 p.m., Saturday, Dec. 14. Visitors, assembled in small groups, embark every few minutes on their "journey." Along the way, they encounter the people to whom what has been called "the greatest story ever told" unfolded, portrayed by actors from several area churches.

Ultimately, the journey takes participants to a stable in Bethlehem, where awaits a baby in a manger who transformed — and saved — humankind. Refreshments and fellowship follow in the historic, 121-year-old Laurel Hill Presbyterian Church.

Unlike most live nativity tableaux, our living nativity is an interactive experience, an opportunity to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas, and for a short while, a chance to eschew the frenzy and commercialism and instead, cleanse your minds to focus on what is most important about the season.

Take time amid the frenzy and clutter of this time of year to pause, reflect and remember what the holiday is all about. It's a journey worth undertaking.

### “BE BORN IN US TODAY”

In 1865, Phillips Brooks, an Episcopal preacher from Boston, went on a Holy Land pilgrimage. Riding horseback from Jerusalem to Bethlehem for Christmas Eve worship at the Church of the Nativity was so moving that he wrote “O Little Town of Bethlehem.” The hymn’s final stanza addresses the town’s most famous newborn:

O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray;  
 Cast out our sin and enter in; be born in us today.  
 We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell;  
 O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!
