The Media Landscape

Voters are more easily disinformed than ever before

All the "Media Guardrails" disappeared as of 2011



The Evolution of Regulating the News Media 1947-2011: The Fairness Doctrine

The Fairness Doctrine of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), introduced in **1949**, was a policy that *required the holders of broadcast licenses, which was the only media platform, both to present controversial issues of public importance and to do so in a manner that fairly reflected differing viewpoints.*

In **1985**, however, the **FCC** decided that the doctrine had a "chilling effect" upon freedom of speech. At about that time, representatives of cable and satellite television networks challenged the applicability of the doctrine to their industries.

In **1987** the **FCC** formally *repealed the fairness doctrine* but maintained both the *editorial and personal-attack provisions, which remained in effect* until **2000.** More than 80 media rules retained language that implemented the doctrine until they were *finally repealed by the commission* in **2011**.

Media Bias / Fake News: Be a Discerning News Consumer



With the proliferation of streaming, web, podcasts, cable and social media, the media options for news consumers are endless...but what can be trusted to be **REAL NEWS**?

- Channels can have *Media Bias*: Extreme right and Extreme left
- Channels can be reliable sources of news OR propaganda

People "self select" their news sources. Cookies track online consumer behavior and reinforce that behavior by serving up similar content. It is easy to go down a rabbit hole of mis-information if you are not a discerning news consumer.









News Reliability in Relation to Media Bias



The "Big Lie" & the January 6th Select Committee Hearings

There is a portion of the US population that still believes Trump won the 2020 Election, in part by being fed and believing **"fake news"**

The January 6th Select Committee has produced evidence indicating that "Team Trump" attempted a deliberate and planned criminal conspiracy to stop the peaceful transfer of power

The Attorney General, Merrick Garland, along with the Department of Justice has convened a Grand Jury

The Grand Jury will determine if Trump and others will be prosecuted for felony crimes, including treason, conspiracy, and sedition.

The Electoral College Elects the President



- When we vote for President, we vote for the electors of a candidate who then vote in the Electoral College.
- The electors generally cast their votes for the winner of the popular vote in their respective states. However, there are several states where this is not required by law.
- Only 29 States and the District of Columbia have legal control over how their electors vote in the Electoral College. As of 2020, there are 17 States that do not legally require their electors to vote in accordance with the state's popular vote.
- In the United States, 270 electoral votes of the 538 electors are currently required to win the presidential election. 270/538 = 51%
- <u>There is an ongoing movement</u> to replace the Electoral College with the Popular Vote.







How was Roe v. Wade Overturned? Republican Presidents Stacked the Supreme Court with Conservatives





- The Supreme Court is a Lifetime Appointment, Nominated by the President and confirmed by Congress. Once a Supreme Court Justice, their decisions become the law of the Land.
- Five Supreme Court Justices appointed during Republican Administrations overturned Roe vs Wade on June 24th, 2022. A woman's right to control her reproductive destiny had been the law of the land since 1973.
- All five of those Judges told Congress in their Congressional confirmation hearings that Roe vs Wade was settled Law, so they lied to Congress in their Congressional hearings.
- An NPR/PBS NewsHour/Marist poll released May 2022 found that 64% of Americans opposed overturning Roe. A June 2022 Gallup Poll shows that support for legal abortion under any or most circumstances jumped among Democrats and is now 82%.
- The Constitution (Article III, Section 1) gives Congress the authority to change the size of the Supreme Court. Congress has used that authority seven times before.
- To restore balance and integrity to a broken institution, some senators have proposed that Congress expand the Supreme Court by four or more seats.

The Filibuster





States elect two U.S. Senators of any party, regardless of the state's population size. Right now, in this Senate, there are 50 Democrats and 50 Republicans.

There is **an arbitrary Senate rule** in place called **the Filibuster**, a parliamentary procedure in which one or more members of a legislative body prolong debate on proposed legislation for the purpose of delaying or entirely preventing a decision. 60 votes are needed to end debate (break the filibuster) and proceed to a vote.

With the Filibuster in place, only select legislation, like the budget, can be passed with simple majority rule. Thus, Democrats need all 50 Senators to vote "YES" on legislation on a split vote. The Vice President, Kamala Harris, then has a vote, which then makes it a "simple majority."

Joe Manchin (West Virginia) and Krysten Sinema (Arizona) refused to support waiving the filibuster in attempts to pass progressive legislation, such as Biden's "Build Back Better" bill.

A call to eliminate the Filibuster is gaining traction

Gerrymandering

The number of elected House of Representatives members is determined by the population of each State based on Census Data calculated every 10 years (2020 is the most recent Census). Each House Representative represents a "District" in that State. **Gerrymandering** refers to how the redistricting lines are drawn geographically in **each State** by the party in power.

Ron DeSantis, Florida Governor, **rejected the 2022 redistricting map** proposed by the FL legislature and replaced it with 20 districts that favor Republicans and just 8 that tilt toward Democrats -- **eliminating districts with heavy concentrations of African American voters and representatives.**

As a result, the Black communities in Jacksonville, Orlando and Tallahassee no longer have a Congressional voice because DeSantis's new map includes surrounding rural areas that dilute their voice with White Republican voters.

Although only 36.2% of all voters in FL are registered as Republicans, gerrymandering has secured 71% of the congressional seats for the REP party

# Gov. Ron DeSantis and the Republican Legislature's Culture War on Florida

**"Stop WOKE Act"** The Florida legislature approved a bill this year that limits how workplaces and schools teach about **race**. Supported by Gov. DeSantis, the measure prohibits trainings that he says might cause someone to feel uncomfortable about the past collective actions of their race.



**THE DEMOCRATIC POSITION:** "History is not there for you to like or dislike. It is there for you to learn from it. And if offends you, you are less likely to repeat it. It's not yours to erase or destroy. "



### Gov. Ron DeSantis and the Republican Legislature's Culture War on Florida

#### "Don't Say Gay" Law

Ron DeSantis signed into law a bill that forbids instruction on sexual orientation and gender identity in kindergarten through third grade

This policy has drawn intense national scrutiny from critics who argue it marginalizes LGBTQ people.

Many young students have LGBTQ parents and should not be shamed.



DeSantis Seeks Rebuke and Revenge



DeSantis signed a bill dissolving Walt Disney World's special district status, as retribution for the company's decision to speak out against his bigoted "Don't Say Gay" law.

**The Law would have abolished Disney's self-governing jurisdiction**, the Reedy Creek Improvement District, which allows it to run its own city in and around the theme park. Without this District, Orange and Osceola counties will be required to pay for services like firefighting, which Disney currently covers, and would have to pay off Reedy Creek's roughly \$1 billion in outstanding bond debt.

Disney is fighting back, noting that the law cannot go into effect unless and until Reedy Creek's debts are first paid off.

DeSantis's act of revenge will not only punish a private company for condemning his anti-LGBTQ+ law, it will also punish Florida residents whose property taxes will go through the roof.

# Gov. Ron DeSantis and the Republican Legislature's Culture War on Florida





**Book Banning is happening in Florida:** HB 1467 gave parents and members of the public increased access to the process of selecting and removing school library books and instructional materials.

**So far, more than 200 Florida school districts have banned books.** The majority of banned books touch on **race** (How to Be an Antiracist by Ibrahim Kendi, The Bluest Eye by Toni Morrison), **sexuality** (Forever by Judy Blume, Brave New World by Aldous Huxley), **and sexual orientation and gender identity** (Two Boys Kissing by David Levithan, Gender Queer: A Memoir by Maia Kobabe).

A Florida Department of Education review of 132 new math books led to the banning of more than 40% of them due to what the state calls "prohibited topics" including critical race theory and social-emotional learning (Newsweek 4/22/22).

### Abortion Restriction Bill Enacted by DeSantis and the FL Legislature

Gov. DeSantis signed a bill this year that makes abortion **illegal after 15 weeks** of pregnancy. It had previously been 24 weeks in Florida.

The law allows *no exceptions for pregnancies resulting from rape, incest, or human trafficking.*

Two Voter Suppression Bills Passed by DeSantis and FL Legislature

#### The 2021 Bill: (SB 90)

- **Cuts back** on the access to ballot drop boxes
- Places **more stipulations** on the use of those drop boxes. Limits the number of ballots a person can deliver from people not in their family -- which is how many with disabilities, the elderly, and low-income citizens vote.
- Adds new voter ID requirements and restrictions for mail-in ballots.
- Makes voters who request vote-by-mail ballots re-register each election cycle to vote that way.
- Limits the distribution of food and water for anyone waiting in line at the polls.

#### The 2022 Bill (SB 524)

- The law unnecessarily increases criminal penalties against third-party voter registration organizations that help people to register to vote. This will chill churches, nonprofits and other organizations from doing voter registration work that is relied upon by hundreds of the thousands of Floridians.
- The creation of an Election Police Force reporting directly to the governor has the potential to intimidate voters and discourage them from participating in the political process.

Taxpayer dollars would be better spent improving access to the ballot and making the voting process more efficient.

# Defeat DeSantis, Defeat Fascism: We all risk his retribution when we don't "get in line."

- The Tampa Rays baseball team spoke out against gun violence on Twitter. In retribution, Gov. DeSantis vetoed \$35 million of state funds that had been approved for its new training facility, saying it was "inappropriate to subsidize political activism of a private corporation.
- In June, DeSantis threatened to impose **a \$27.5 million fine** on the Special Olympics if it insisted on a Covid-19 vaccination mandate for participants. The charity backed down and eliminated the requirement.
- On Aug 4th, DeSantis **removed from office the elected State** Attorney of Hillsborough County, Andrew Warren. The reason: Warren said in a June statement "we decline to use our offices' resources to criminalize reproductive health decisions."





Special Olympics



Democratic Challenger to Gov. DeSantis is CHARLIE CRIST



- Charlie Crist is currently the Democratic US Congressman representing Florida's 13th District (St Petersburg, FL)
- He was Governor of Florida 2007-2011. As Governor, he:
  - Prevented massive teacher layoffs during the recession, working with the Obama Administration to use federal stimulus funding to save 20,000 teachers' jobs.
  - Stopped radical attacks on women's rights, vetoing laws to restrict a woman's right to choose.
  - Led efforts to protect civil rights, taking action to automatically restore voting rights of non-violent exfelons and to extend voting hours across the state for all Floridians.
  - A staunch environmental advocate, he secured a landmark land acquisition to preserve the Florida Everglades, and fought to hold BP accountable after the 2010 oil spill that ravaged Florida's coastline.
- He was Florida Attorney General from 2003-2007
- He was Florida Commissioner of Education from 2001-2003, where he put education first.

# <u>Charlie Crist on</u> <u>the Issues</u>



#### • Defending Reproductive Rights

• On Day 1, sign an Executive Order protecting the right to access a safe abortion as guaranteed by the Florida Constitution and the United States Constitution.

#### • Voting Is A Right

- Reverse the DeSantis limits on mail ballots, which are opposed by the local supervisors of elections. If the Legislature refuses to act, he will declare a state of emergency before the next general election and make the changes himself.
- Declare Election Day a state holiday so every voter has more opportunity to cast their ballots.

#### Clean Water For All

- Reduce the run-off from farms and ranches
- Implement recommendations of the Harmful Algae Bloom Task Force on red tide
- Replace all septic tanks and stop new ones in urban areas
- Support water storage and wetland restoration
- Protect Florida's freshwater springs
- Fully fund and staff the Dept of Environmental Protection

## US Senate Race: Challenger is Val Demings / Democrat



#### Background

**Congresswoman Val Demings** was the first in her family of seven children to attend college, became a social worker and then a police officer, rising to become Orlando's first female Police Chief.

Chief Demings served 27 years and at every rank level in the Orlando Police Department. She commanded the Special Operations division and coordinated the response of the Airport Division on 9/11.

In 2007, she made history when she was appointed to serve as Orlando's first female Chief of Police. She drove down violent crime by 40 percent.

In 2016, Chief Demings was elected by the voters of Florida's 10th District to serve in Congress. She has gained a reputation as a tireless champion for public safety, civil rights, and the American Dream that had given her a chance to succeed.

## Val Demings on the Issues

#### ENVIRONMENT

Demings knows the threat of climate change is real and takes threats to our environment seriously. She opposes offshore drilling off Florida's coasts, and has delivered funding to combat the toxic algae that impacts our shores and waterways. She voted to bring \$1 billion in funding to protect the Florida Everglades. Deming support of the infrastructure bill which will fund billions of dollars of climate change-resistant infrastructure in Florida and create thousands of new jobs.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

As a former 27-year law enforcement officer, Chief Val Demings **fought to increase funding for our law enforcement officers** so communities across Florida can have the resources they need to hire more officers and keep us all safe.

#### NATIONAL SECURITY
