Again, thank you for coming to our show. Happy quilting!

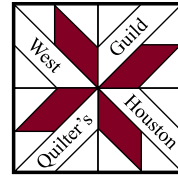

The Meetings

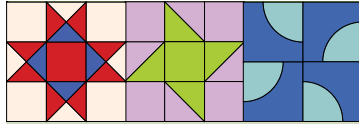
Our meetings are held at The Glazier Education Center, 16600 Pine Forest Ln., Houston TX 77084, 16600 Pine Forest Ln., Houston TX 77084 on the third Wednesday of every month, beginning at 6:45 p.m. with social time from 6:15 p.m.–6:45 p.m. Each month members share their latest accomplishments with “Show and Tell.” We have a short business meeting before enjoying our speaker. Past speakers have included Sue Nickels, Cynthia England, Brenda Jeschke, Bonnie Hunter, and Paula Barnes. Some months we are also able to offer a separate workshop with that month's speaker.

We design our programs to be attractive and educational for all levels of quilters, from beginner to experienced. Every meeting provides new tips and/or inspiration.

Community Service / Project Linus – Because of the generosity of our members, the Community Service Committee has been able over the past several years to donate and/or distribute on an annual basis more than 200 quilts to area nursing homes, 150 or more stockings to Cypress Assistance Ministries, 200 quilts and premie blankets to the Project Linus program at Texas Children's Hospital and other Medical Center hospitals, and a number of Quilts of Valor.

Disaster Relief Stockpile – West Houston Quilter's Guild members are very generous people. In addition to the customary charitable donations (e.g. Linus Quilts, Quilts of Valor, and the like), members contribute a bed sized quilt to be “stockpiled” in case of a natural disaster in our State. Should a natural disaster hit a community within the borders of Texas, bed sized quilts in the “stockpile” will be shipped to the area as an immediate response to calls for aid. It is our privilege to support our communities through the gifting of quilts in a time when it feels as though all is lost.

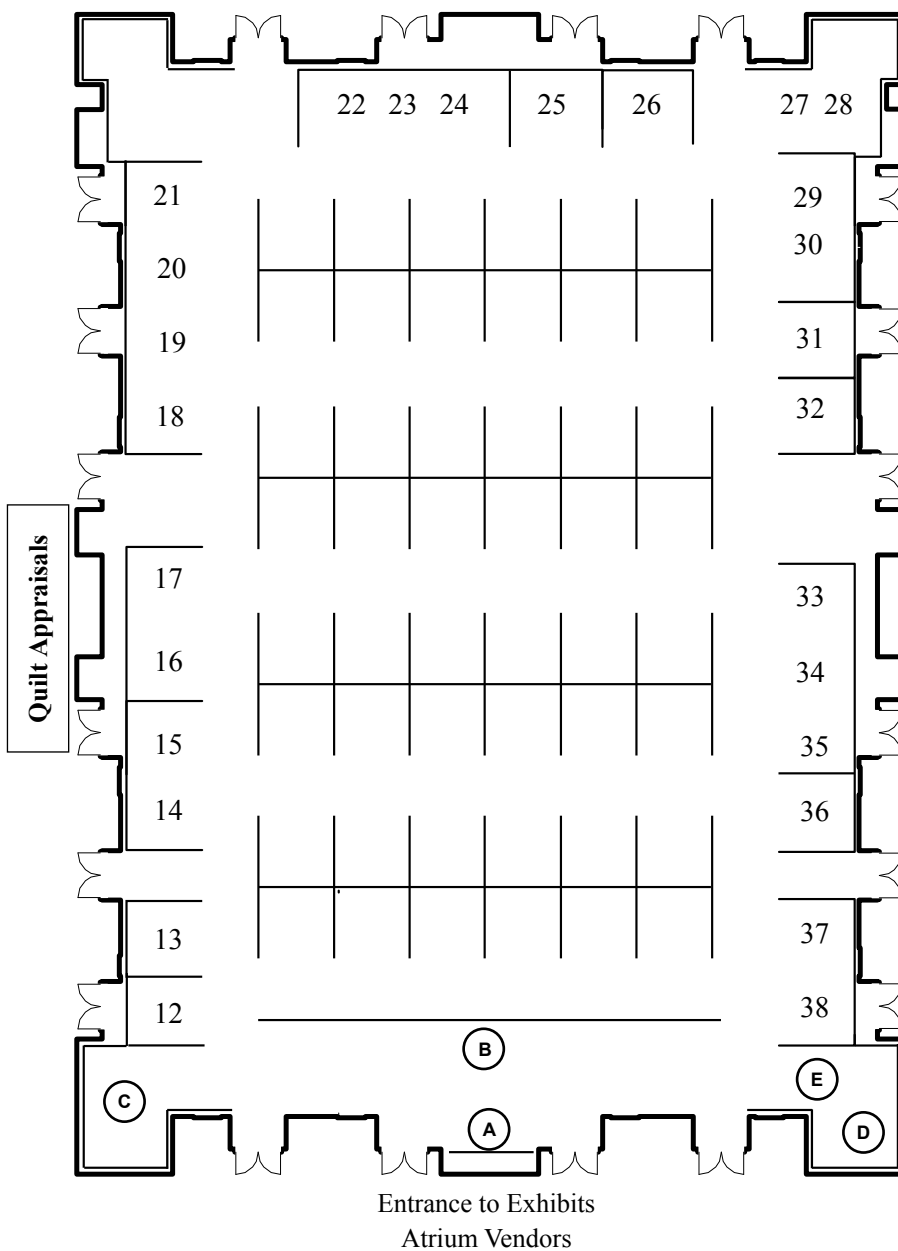

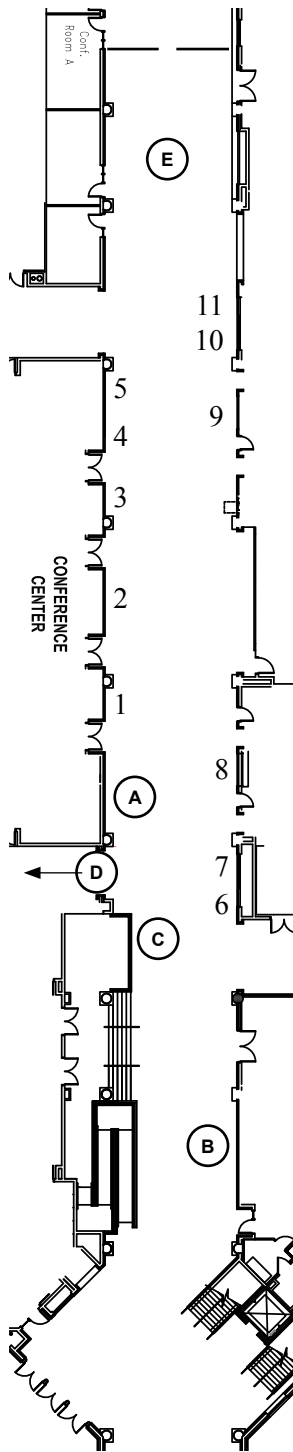

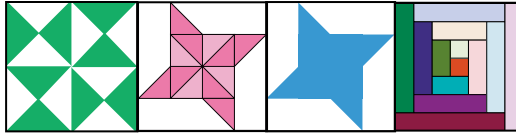

QUILT SHOW ETIQUETTE

The quilts in our show are all on loan—privately owned treasures that the exhibitors have agreed to publicly display for your pleasure. We ask that you follow a few rules to safeguard these treasures and to make the show an enjoyable experience.

- Do not touch the quilts, no matter how tempting. If you would like a closer look, please use the plastic glove given to you at the entrance. Natural oils, dirt, even acids found on people's fingers may increase the deterioration of textile fabrics.
- Do not bring food or drinks into the quilt exhibition area. There is a concession area available for your enjoyment in the atrium.
- Control children at ALL times. Unsupervised children will be given a puppy to take home.
- No smoking.
- Photography is allowed in the exhibit area. Many of the quilts on display are true works of art and are original designs. Please honor that by getting permission before posting any photographs on the Web. Please get permission from individual vendors before photographing their products. Many have protective copyrights.
- Please “ooh” and “ahh” all you want; we do love to watch others enjoy our quilts.

Awards for Merit are 1st, 2nd, and 3rd with Honorable Mention in some categories with numerous entries.

Best of Show – All three judges select the winner of this award

Judge's Choice – Each judge picks their favorite quilt

President's Choice – Selected by the president of the guild

Viewers' Choice – Show visitors vote for their favorite quilt. Votes are tallied and announced on the last day of the show.

EXPLANATION OF QUILT DESCRIPTIONS

Master/Professional: Quilt entrant earns money from quilting (creating patterns, writing books, teaching, making or quilting quilts for others for pay).

Artisan: Quilting is a hobby and no money is earned from it.

Machine Quilting: Domestic sewing machine (machine is stationary) AND/OR Longarm, mid- arm or short-arm - (where machine head moves)

Bed size: A quilt is intended to be used on a bed or cover a person (lap or throws). Not intended to be displayed as art/wall hanging/home décor item.

Small: Any quilt with every side less than 75".

Large: Any quilt which is 75" or larger on any side.

One person: The same person who pieced the quilt is also the quilter.

Two person: The quilter is different from the person who pieced the quilt.
