Italian Heritage Best Hidden Gems in Italy

Urbino (ur[bi.no) is a beautiful walled city in the Marche region of Italy southwest of Pesaro, which was a creative hub during the Renaissance. Nestled on a high and sloping hillside, Urbino was first a Roman then medieval town, eventually becoming the seat of the Archbishop of Urbino. Since 1998, the historic center of Urbino has been a UNESCO World Heritage site.




Urbino retains much of its picturesque medieval aspect. It

hosts the University of Urbino, founded in 1506. Its best-known architectural piece is the Palazzo Ducale, rebuilt by Luciano Laurana. Urbino is probably the most recognized name on small town lists, but it certainly makes the case as a place to visit in Italy. Despite the fact that many people know the name, only a few will actually venture to visit Urbino, which is tucked away from the rest of the world. The town is a romantic place. The population is approximately 8,800, The distance from Urbino to Italy's capital Rome is approximately 127 miles.



The Palazzo Ducale, or Ducal Palace, is regarded as one of the finest Renaissance palaces in all of Italy. At one point, Urbino was one of the most popular, powerful places in Italy, and this palace was its central source of strength and wealth. Today, you can tour the palace and learn all about its history. While many of its Renaissance treasures were shipped off to Florence as a dowery centuries ago, this place is still beautiful and worth checking out. Most people will tell you that this is the best thing to do in Urbino.

Arguably, Italy's most beautiful art is its cathedrals. Every city you visit will likely have a stunning cathedral, and Urbino is no different. The Urbino Cathedral is just a stone's throw away from the Palazzo Ducale, and it is definitely worth checking out. Made of beautiful white stone, this imposing church sits right at the top of a square and is as beautiful on the inside as it is on the outside.





Raffaello Sanzio Italian Painter, is one of the most famous Italian artists of all time. They even named a Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle after him, so you know he is right there alongside Michelangelo. In many ways, Raffaello is the posterchild of Urbino and is one of the most famous people to ever be born in this city. Naturally, one of the best things to do in Urbino is visit the preserved house (museum) of its biggest superstar! If you have the time, this is really a can't-miss kind of place.

The Albornoz Fortress was built in the second half of the fourteenth century, at the behest of Cardinal Egidio Alvares, on the Piano del Monte. Its favorable position allows it to dominate the whole city. Over the years it was rebuilt and partially modified, due to various damages during the war. Today it is a wonderful fortress, in excellent condition and a stop you don't want to miss.

The Piazza Della Repubblica might not be the *main* square of the city, but it is definitely the most lively one. This square is lined with great cafes, gelato shops, restaurants, and stores. This is definitely the best part of the city to sit down and drink a coffee or have an aperitivo (Italian Happy hour).

Urbino is filled with gastronomy (little food stores) where you can purchase fresh cheeses, flavorful prosciutto, sweet breads, piadine (an Italian flat bread), and fresh pasta, like passatelli (delicious in truffle sauce).

Some of the traditional foods of the province owe much to history too. Many are no longer everyday fare, but can still be sampled on special occasions, such as granetti (corn bread), sheep's milk cheese such as caciotta, prized white truffles, fratterosa (baked guinea fowl), and all manner of meat sausages. Try formaggio di Fossa, a specialty cheese aged in cellars cut into the limestone mountains near Apecchio.
