



History of the W. A. Pattillo Alumni Association, Inc.

The W. A. Pattillo Alumni Association was the vision of four individuals: Nathan Lewis, William Boyd, Rayfield Perkins, and George Worsley. Following a financially successful reunion in 1978, Nathan Lewis and members of the Class of 1955 agreed to donate the proceeds to organize an alumni association. Planning meetings were scheduled with Nathan, Rayfield and William encouraging other graduates to attend along with George contacting members of the classes of 1939, 1940, and 1941. The "vision" was taking shape and the participants established national alumni associations since many participants were from out-of-state, mainly Philadelphia, PA and Washington, DC.

In 1981, former students of the Tarboro colored High School, the W.A. Pattillo High School and Princeville Elementary School gathered for the first reunion. The Tarboro Colored High School group had been informally organized in the late 1970s and this membership basically included the graduating classes of 1924 through 1943. Those involved with this group were Ethel Lewis, Helen Knight, William Ruffin, Grady Ashe, Elizabeth McMillian, Susanna Thomas, George Matthewson, Maude Bullock Porter, Lorna Pitt and others. The "plan" was in motion.

After the first reunion, more supporters came. They were Eunice Parker, Evelyn Faulk, Grace Swinson, Iris Braswell, Rev. James Wooten, Myrna Deloatch, Hubert Simmons, Charlie Brown, Elizabeth McMillan, Helen Newton Knight, George Matthewson, and Lois Cobb. The "dream" was taking shape. At this time, Nathan Lewis served as Interim National President and Iris Braswell was elected as the Tarboro Chapter President. In 1982, Alfred Norfleet was elected as the Washington, DC President and in 1983; Grady Ashe was elected as the Baltimore Chapter President. In 1983, under the leadership of President, Earlene Womack Lawrence, the alumni association obtained its state charter and was incorporated as the W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Incorporated. Charter members were Jimmie Bullock, Thomas Perry, Grady E. Ashe, Lorna Lloyd, Helen Knight, Iris Braswell, Cora Boddie and George Matthewson.

History of the W.A. Pattillo Alumni Association, Inc. (continued)

In 1985 the Tidewater Chapter was formed. The "vision" had become a reality. The past presidents have been Nathan Lewis, Jimmie Bullock, Barbara Bratcher Anderson, Earlene Knight Womack, Eva Norfleet, Thomas Newton, and Varnell Vines Kinnin. The association's current president is Fred S. Wood, Jr.

After a re-organization in July 2002, the purpose of the Association was revised, and according to its articles of incorporation, is to (1) provide scholarship, grants, etc. to students which the organization deems worthy of the same for purposes of assisting them in furthering their education; (2) provide financial and other assistance to educational institutions at all levels; (3) purchase books, equipment, etc. for the benefit and use of educational, social and civic organizations whose purposes or functions are related to promoting and enriching the lives of citizens; and, (4) promote and conduct social programs and events in communities for purposes of raising funds and promoting communications. Since the inception of the alumni association, approximately \$80,000 in scholarship funds have been awarded to area high school students to attend four-year colleges, community colleges and universities throughout the United States.

Under the present leadership of President Wood, the Officers and Board of Directors, the organization is forging into the 21st century in a concerted effort to promote and expand the focus of W. A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Inc. and to broaden its scope in the local, state and national communities.

Reflections from the Past

(The following reflections written by Mrs. Susanna Thomas were published in the 1991 reunion booklet.)

What I have written here are facts that I, Susanna Matthewson Thomas, obtained while I was in Tarboro. I can not tell anyone about the years that I was in college, graduate school and the years that I was away from the Tarboro area. Consequently, I have given facts that I was able to give ...those I was able to remember.

In 1919, there was no school in the Tarboro area. When a student finished the eighth grade and had a desire to continue their education, the student would have to attend a school away from home in a selected school.

Parents of the area became aware of the need to have a school beyond the eighth grade level. Local parents and community leaders met in the Masonic Hall located on the corner of Church and Panola Streets to discuss the issue. Churches of the area also played a vital part. Reports from other schools nearby were instrumental in the decision to solicit a Board for the high school.

In 1920, the Board of Education gave permission to develop a high school in the area. The building was placed on St. John Street where the school is now located as an elementary school. Mr. W.A. Pattillo was hired as principal of the school. Grades nine, ten, and eleven were subsequently added to complete the certification requirements.

Development of the curriculum continued and in 1924 the first high school graduation took place. The principal and teachers had done their jobs well.

The Colored High School of Tarboro grew and as the years passed it became a first class school. This being true, the graduates had no trouble entering colleges of their choice. As the school grew, the need for additional classrooms became quite evident. Other buildings were eventually erected and included a gym, a construction shop, and a home economics room.

As the years passed, the boys wanted some type of Athletic Program. There was no coach, so Dr. Y. D. Garrett, Jr. attempted some type of football program for several years. Later, the principal and other male teachers decided to try organized football. A coach was needed and Mr. Kelly Bryant from Rocky Mount was hired. During the years Kelly Bryant coached, the teams showed that they were well trained and developed.

Several years later the athletic team decided that they wanted a name like many of the other schools in the area. A committee was chosen with Kelly as the chairman. Discussions were held with the Board of Education. After many different names were discussed, Kelly suggested the name Walter Alexander Pattillo. Thus the name was chosen for W.A. Pattillo School. The name is still there today and will be for years to come.

The Walter Alexander Pattillo school principals and teachers who served this area had the art of instruction. Thus they made it possible for students to gain knowledge. Many of them have been successful in life. I hope that those who attend W.A. Pattillo School will continue to be students of frugality.

Those who endured have found a better life, because of the academic and athletic life they were exposed to.

The bottom line to all of that – we had a dedicated group of teachers.

Space won't permit me to name names. You know the teachers and students.

P.S. How about those hot basketball games? Pattillo – Conetoe, Phillips and Carver!







Charles Ashby (Posthumously)

Charles was a varsity football and baseball player during his stay at Pattillo. He played as a tight end on the football team from 1954-55. Charles broke loose an 85 yard touchdown run in a game when Pattillo smashed Herford 25-0. In January 1956, he received All-State honors for his outstanding performance in football during the 1955 season. After his graduation in 1956, Charles left North Carolina in 1957 to live in New York. He married Willie Jean Hammond, also a Pattillo alumus. They had one son, Bernardo Ashby. Charles worked in private sanitation for most of his work career. He passed away in September of 1983.



William Henry Boyd

William, fondly called "Henny Penny," was a member of the class of 1959. While in high school, he participated in varsity football as an offensive and defensive tackle and an outfielder and catcher on the baseball team. His athletic career spanned from 1954 through 1957. William was employed by Carolina telephone for 35 years. He is retired and currently resides in Princeville, North Carolina.

John Davis (Posthumously)

John was a varsity football tackle who played from 1952 through 1955. He was a starting tackle in one of Pattillo High School's greatest football teams – the 1953 undefeated State 2-A Champions. He received honors from the Daily Southerner Newspaper, the Sportsman Club and church. John was a member of the class of 1956.

William Howard Dickens (Posthumously)

Bill grew up as a member of Eastern Star Baptist Church and sang in the choir when he as a young boy. At Pattillo he excelled as a star athlete receiving medals in baseball, basketball and football. After graduation in 1949, Willie enlisted in the United States Army, proudly serving his country for over 25 years. He bravely fought in the Korean and Vietnam wars receiving such notable decorations as the Purple Heart, Bronze Star, National Defense Service Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Upon his retirement, he continued to serve his fellow veterans and country by volunteering at the Veteran's Administration in Cleveland, Ohio. Willie died on March 6, 2012 in Morris Center Hospice in Jacksonville, Florida. All that knew him will remember his love of his country, his wife and the Lord.

William "Bill" Jones (Posthumously)

Bill played varsity football from 1952 through 1955. He was a fullback. In 1955, he was named to the All State Football Team. During the season, he scored 86 points. Bill was also a member of the 1953 2-A Championship Football Team. He graduated from Pattillo in the class of 1956.



Melvin Thomas Knight (Posthumously)

Known to many as "Hawk" and "Bookie" to others, Melvin attended Pattillo High School from 1942 until 1954. He played on the varsity football team from 1952-54. Hawk played the position of center. Melvin was a member of the renowned undefeated championship team of 1953. He served as captain of the football team that year. After graduation he worked in the Tarboro area and married his high school sweetheart, Dorothy Cotton. He later moved to Dayton, Ohio where he eventually enlisted in the US Army and served his country proudly. Unfortunately, on October 2, 1965, he was killed in a car accident. Had he lived, he would have enjoyed sharing memories of his Pattillo football days with his son, Melvin Jr., grandson, 4 granddaughters and 4 great grandsons.



Rayfield Perkins

Rayfield is a native of Princeville, North Carolina. He is married to Delia Wood Perkins. They have six children, nine grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He is a member of St. Luke Church of Christ where he serves as an Elder. Rayfield graduated from W.A. Pattillo High School in 1955. He retired from Sprint in 1997. While is high school, Rayfield was a member of the band. He played the saxophone. He also played football and was a member of the 1953 2-A State championship team. Rayfield currently lives in Princeville and spends his time enjoying family and friends.



Richard Ward

While attending high school, Richard participated in varsity football from 1952-1954. He was a member of the 1953 2-A State Championship Team. Richard presently resides in Brooklyn, New York.


