Dear Parishioners:

As some of you may have heard already (and I did mention this previously), there will be a Synod in Vatican City State this coming Fall. To prepare for that all dioceses around the world were asked to compile data to be sent to the national conference which will be forwarded to the Synod. In our diocese each parish is being asked to participate. What I would like all of you to think about (and please if you would like to respond, do so - young or old, man or woman, boy or girl), and forward your comments to the office. I will compile the comments and send them on. I would like these by May 28.

Here are some questions for your consideration (this is by no means exhaustive; it's just some starting points):

In our diocese and parish, who are those who "walk together"? Who are those who seem further apart?

How are we called to grow as companions?

What groups or individuals are left on the margins?

What facilitates or inhibits our listening?

How well do we listen to those on the peripheries?

How is the contribution of consecrated men and women integrated? What are some limitations in our ability to listen, especially to those who have different views than our own?

What enables or hinders speaking up courageously, candidly, and responsibly in our diocese, our parish, and in society?

When and how do we manage to say what is important to us?

How does the relationship with the local media work (not only Catholic media)?

Who speaks on behalf of the Christian community, and how are they chosen?


