Ponderings From The Pastor

INVESTING IN GOD'S FUTURE: CLOTHED WITH HOPE

NEXT MONTH, at our June congregational meeting (6/24/18) the members of St. Paul UCC are going to be asked to spend some money. We'll be talking about "endowments" and "investments." So before we get to the specifics of what you will be asked to consider, let look at these two words, their origins, and what they really mean.

These are the several definitions of the word "investment:" a) an allocation of money (or sometimes another resource, such as time) in the expectation of some benefit in the future; b) devote one's time, effort, or energy to a particular undertaking with the expectation of a worthwhile result; c) buy (something) whose usefulness will repay the cost; d) provide or endow someone or something with a particular quality or attribute (and you'll see, for what St. Paul needs to do, all these definitions apply!).

Interestingly, the word *investment* comes from old Latin, specifically from vestis (clothing), and vestire (to clothe); by the mid-16th century, to invest meant to clothe something or someone. Religious and clergy attire, such as albs, cassocks, surplices (the white "half-ropes" our youth acolytes wear) and stoles (like I sometimes wear on Sundays with my preaching robe) are still known today as vestments.

I suppose an English professor or linguistics expert could explain how a word meaning "to clothe" or "dress up" changed over the centuries to mean *allocating money for a future profit*, but my feeble brain can't quite make the connection! But, it does bring to mind how the New Testament speaks, in several places, about "clothing ourselves" in Christ. For example, **Romans 13.14** says "Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh" And, **Galatians 3:27-28** says "As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." The Romans verse is about overcoming selfishness and living a Spirit-led existence; and Galatians implies that our baptism is an "investing" in Christ which makes us all equal—and united—with equal access to God's grace and promises in Christ.

Then there is **Colossians 3:9-10**: "Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on (clothed with) the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator." And the resurrected Jesus himself, speaking to the disciples just before his ascension (**Luke 24.49**) uses this very same language and imagery: "I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." Wow...and here's where it gets even more interesting...

Recall that the New Testament was written in Greek—well before being translated into Latin. The same Greek root word, translated "put on" or "clothe," enduo, is used in all these verses mentioned above—and 28 times total in the New Testament. About this pre-Latin word *enduo*, Strong's Exhaustive Concordance says: "**From en and duno (in the sense of sinking into a garment); to invest with clothing (literally or figuratively) - array, clothe (with), endue, have (put) on.**" Hmm...to *endue*. The first definition/synonym of this word is endow. And when you look up *endue's* roots, it goes back to the Latin induere, which means—you guessed it!!—"put on clothes."

Ponderings From The Pastor (continued)

So what does all this mean? Well, we see that *invest(ment)* and *endow(ment)* have the same origins and meanings...and, that when we speak of *investing* in an *endowment*, there are clear theological and Biblical overtones! Overtones of trusting God, of being united in spirit and purpose (and grace), of transformed lives and living out of our True ("new") selves and not our False ("old") selves; most important of all we see God investing us (clothing us) with holy power and hope! Think "Pentecost." Who knew??!!

With all this in mind, I want to introduce to you **NEW BEGINNINGS**. THIS is what you are going to be asked to INVEST in; and to ENDOW your Church with a Spirit-led, God-centered, motivating, thriving FUTURE. You are going to be asked to CLOTHE YOURSELVES and St. Paul's future with HOPE!



Specifically, **NEW BEGINNINGS** is an **assessment and coaching process** to lead the church to a BOLD NEW VISION...to help the congregation as a whole make a bold and definitive decision about the church's future direction(s). It is a very structured, tried, and tested process for vision discernment.

New Beginnings originated a few years back in the Disciples of Christ (the UCC's closest partner denomination), and was quickly "adopted" into UCC church vitality ministries on the national and conference levels. Now, a few years later, SIX different denominations and over a thousand churches have undertaken the New Beginnings process, with some very powerful results. Several churches in our own "neighborhood" (Mt. Healthy Christian Church—host church of the Mt. Healthy Alliance Food Pantry—and Carthage Christian Church) have used or are currently engaged in **New Beginnings**.

MUCH MORE information will be forthcoming to you over the next two months, in every way we can share it...so watch the weekly bulletins, our St. Paul website and Facebook page, AND your mail (you'll be getting a letter about **New Beginnings** in the not too distant future, including information about the costs involved). For now, I ask you for just two things: Pondering and Praying. Ponder what it might look like for St. Paul to be building many new, meaningful "bridges" into the community around us...growing in strength, in spirit, and even in numbers! Ponder what it would feel like to hear people talking about "that church by the high school that is so cool, and so active, and so helpful!" And...PRAY...daily...for God to help us get this process approved and launched, for a surging of the Spirit among and through us, and a powerful new sense of moving forward. Pray for God's graces to be powerfully evident among us in this time. Pray consistently that St. Paul can and will find a new beginning...and PUT ON (invest) the garment of HOPE!

Council Vice President, Jan Apro, called the meeting to order at 7:03 P.M. Pastor Barry offered an opening prayer. Nancy Klusmeier asked Council to review the minutes of the February 19, 2018, Council Meeting. A **MOTION** was made (Ritz/Fassnacht) to approve the February Council minutes. **MOTION PASSED** and the minutes were approved as printed.

Sr. Minister's Report (Rev. Barry Bordenkircher)

- Pastor Barry reported that he didn't have a lot of mileage this past month. He had the flu and it took up a couple weeks so he didn't want to visit people in person.
- Evelyn's service went really well. We've been getting a lot of memorials.
- We have a baptism scheduled for April 8th. It is family from the Nursery School named Floyd. He's hoping they come to church.
- We will have a new member Sunday soon – May or June.
- Cluster II Pulpit Exchange is April 22nd and he will go to Truth & Destiny UCC on North Bend. That afternoon at 3 P.M. is Choir Fest. Trish Richards will lead it.

- On April 29th, we will have an all generation (Evelyn style) event – Cinco de Mayo lunch.
- Pentecost – May 20th – Communion.
- Pastor Barry reviewed with Council some handouts on “New Beginnings”. This is a Vision Discernment that he thinks we might use. It is a process that helps churches answer one question: “What is God calling our congregation to do and be in this time and this place?” Cost will be about \$3,500. This will probably be presented at the June Congregational Meeting so the congregation understands what is going on and votes on it.

Care Team (Marge Fassnacht)

- She is still working on getting her budget together. Dealing with less money. She will bring to the congregation for approval at the June meeting.
- The Alliance is still hanging on. They thought they found someone to lead it but they didn't pass the background check. Big issue is that it's part-time. Margaret suggested checking with Universities to see if any students would be interested.

Facilities Team (Anne Zimmer for Rick Davis)

- The company for the roof has agreed to do part of the job for the price agreed to with insurance company. Does not include everything. Rick is going to get another company to see if they are willing.
- The elevator inspection failed because the emergency light and alarm doesn't work. Rick is looking into whether it is because of the battery which we could fix.
- Mike fixed the office door.
- Rick is still having a lot of issues with his knee.
- Mark Heitman replaced a ballast on lights and fixed plug by Joan's office.
- Jan Apro reported that he contacted the insurance company's Risk Management Program to find out what they want us to do regarding security matters.

Finance Team (Margaret Maybury)

- Margaret reported that she met with Anne to go over what we can do to reduce expenses.

Treasurer's Report (Anne Zimmer)

- Anne reviewed with Council the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual and the Balance Sheet. She had added a few things. She's learning a lot about the new computer program.
- Roof repair insurance money went into the Good Samaritan Fund but we can't use it. She just put it there until the roof is repaired.
- As always, copies of financial reports are available in the office for anyone who wishes to see them.

Endowment Report (Jan Apro)

- In February, we lost \$6,846 on both funds. The market is like a rollercoaster. Hope things will stabilize in the next few months.

- Karen had shared at their meeting that enrollment for Nursery School is coming along slowly. She is going to advertise more.
- Nursery School will have a budget proposed in May.
- The water fountain is fixed. Karen said thank you.
- Nursery School's annual carnival in March made \$1,430 (for Elaine Payne Scholarship Fund).
- The next Nursery School/Church Summit Meeting will be April 23rd at 6:30 P.M.
- Discussion about a visit from a local church youth group regarding LOGOS Program for youth. Pastor Barry said we may possibly have an informal gathering of millennial's from our church (sons and daughters of members) led by himself.
- June 10th is Teacher/Graduates/Music Program Recognition "Celebration Sunday".
- Mothers' Day – Flowers, etc.

Worship Team (Vicky Ritz)

- Palms are in the refrigerator for Palm Sunday.
- Pastor Barry said there will be a Sunrise Service outside in the courtyard or in the Chapel depending on the weather.
- Maundy Thursday (combining Good Friday) service will be in the chapel.

Vice President's Report (Jan Apro)

- Zwoster Scholarship – The Committee already approved Chelsey Davis because she is ready to start a summer session. A **MOTION** was made (Klusmeier/Woods) to approve scholarship money (\$500 + \$500, total \$1,000) for Chelsey. **MOTION PASSED.**

Lay Minister's Report (Joan Allen)

- She attended the Nurture Meeting, attends Community Dinners when she can, staff meeting, prepared sermon for 2/25, prepared class lessons, attended Cluster II on 3/15, working on cleaning out nursery room and old SS classroom downstairs with Vickie Bryant and Kim Ferry, working on cleaning out the Sunday school to be SPY and SS office, working on Evelyn's office (slow process).
- Right now she is preparing for Lock-in this weekend (23rd-24th) and making candy for the sale on Sunday.
- She is working with Vickie Bryant and Kim Ferry on Sunrise Service Breakfast.
- She started collecting water for the parade.
- Mileage: Visited Evelyn (Tim) – 6 miles; Cluster – 14 miles; SPY meeting 5.6 miles.
- SPY will plant flowers at the lock in, by the parking lot wall.
- Kids took dirt and ashes from Ash Wednesday and will plant a magnolia tree in memory of Evelyn in the courtyard. They will work on this at the lock-in. They will put a plaque or stone there when they plant.
- Discussion regarding SPY building a float for Memorial Day. Joan asked Anne for scouts' help.

OLD BUSINESS

- Pastor Barry distributed to Council Tenebrae Readings for Maundy Thursday and asked if anyone would volunteer to read to e-mail him or let him know. He would like to use the candelabra that we use for weddings at the service.

- SONKA Spring Gathering is April 28 in Kettering if anyone would like to go.

A **MOTION** was made (Maybury/Ritz) to adjourn. **MOTION PASSED** and the meeting adjourned at 8:29 P.M. with The Lord's Prayer.

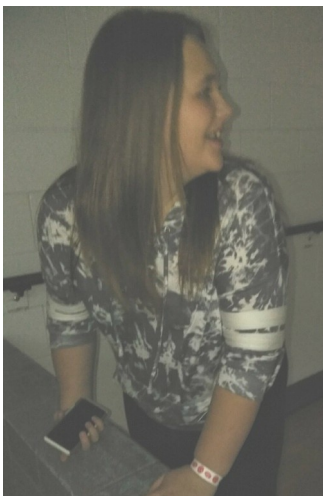
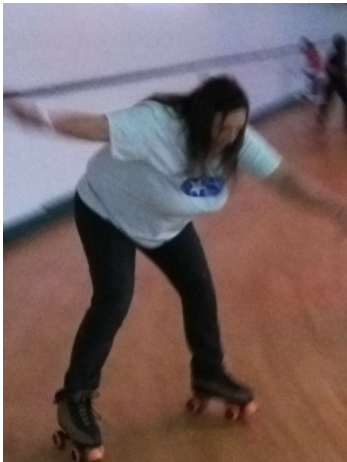


The SPY will be doing a Rock-a-thon on June 10th with all the monies going to cancer research. So, please consider giving when asked by a SPY to sponsor us.

We have another Dine and Donate at The Italianette Pizza on Wednesday, May 9th (all day) Dine or Carry Out. Please show them the flyer above.

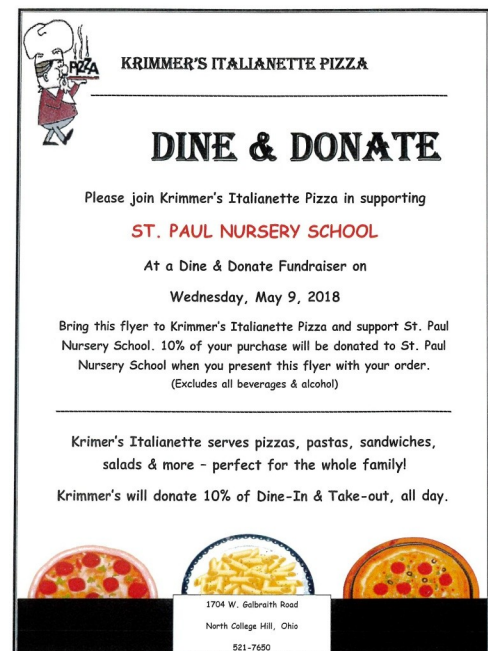
