If your child is 3 or 4 and receiving Disability Living Allowance, then your child care provider could receive £615 per year to support them in the setting each year. Children attending a Foundation 2 class in school would not be eligible.

What is it?

The Disability Access Fund (DAF) is funding for early years providers including Foundation 1 classes in schools, to support children with disabilities or special educational needs. It aids access to early years places by supporting providers in making reasonable adjustments to their settings.

Who can get the funding?

3- and 4-year olds will be eligible for the Disability Access Fund if they meet the following criteria:

- the child is in receipt of child Disability Living Allowance (DLA) and;
- the child accesses the funded entitlement at the early years provider

How do I apply?

To check eligibility, you will need to complete a form with your childcare provider and provide evidence of your child's disability living allowance (DLA). Your childcare provider will then contact the Family Information Service by email fis@wirral.gov.uk, sharing your evidence of DLA.
