

Restoration Status & Partnering




The Board of Directors met August 3 with historic preservation architects Lynn Scott Paden and his wife to begin the process of developing a Building Preservation and Sustainability Plan for the mansion property by the end of the year. The Padens, now based in Washington, DC, have strong roots in Lancaster County and are quite interested in the restoration of the Haldeman Mansion and its property.

The Padens have Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Architecture. Lynn, originally from Manheim Township, is a graduate of Tulane University. His wife, originally from Spain, is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania. Their experience in historic restoration is extensive, including such notable projects as the Lancaster Central Market and, currently, the Blair House official guest residence, across from the White House in Washington, D.C.

A completed Building and Preservation Plan will facilitate the Society's pursuit of additional grants. The competition is keen. However, we are blessed with a very significant, historic property whose story resonates. Our future grant application efforts will focus on dollar matching, a requirement for most grants, and partnering with other organizations. We would be pleased to hear from members who may have ideas and/or leads to assist the Society in developing partnerships with other organizations.
