This is the original fireplace surround, though it is not known exactly when it was put in! Paul the stonemason has repaired the head with a dowel repair, before fitting back in place.


This is the mantle top, which he has also repaired. If you look closely you can identify the repaired area, three quarters of the way along. This he has skilfully achieved with two stainless steel dowels which are barely visible; very clever chap, our Paul!


Mike the electrician is busy fitting the new distribution board for the enhanced electrical arrangement in the two vestries. It will be neatly hidden away behind the Victorian panelling, so as not to intrude on the attractive room, which will one day soon be full of life again!
