A little boy greets his father as he came back from work with a question. ***“Daddy, how much do you make an hour?”*** The father is surprised and says: ***“Look son, not even your mother knows. Don’t bother me now, I’m tired.”*** ***“But Daddy, just tell please! How much do you make an hour?”*** the boy persisted. The father finally gives up and replies: ***“\$20 bucks.”*** ***“Okay, Daddy,”*** the boy continues. ***“Could you loan me \$10 bucks?”*** The father yells at him: ***“So that was the reason you asked how much I earn, right? Now, go to sleep and don’t bother me anymore!”***

In the middle of the night the father thinks over what he said and felt guilty. May be his son needed to buy something. Finally, he goes to his son’s room. ***“Are you asleep, son?”*** asks the father. ***“No, Daddy. Why?”*** replies the boy. ***“Here is the money you asked for earlier,”*** the father said. ***“Thanks, Daddy!”*** The boy replies and receives the money. Then he reached under his pillow and brings out some more money, ***“Now I have enough! Priest: Alleluia, alleluia.

Priest: Observe, my son, your father's bidding, and reject not your mother's teaching.

GOSPEL: Luke 2:41-52

Priest: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

All: Glory be to You, Lord!

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him

among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.
