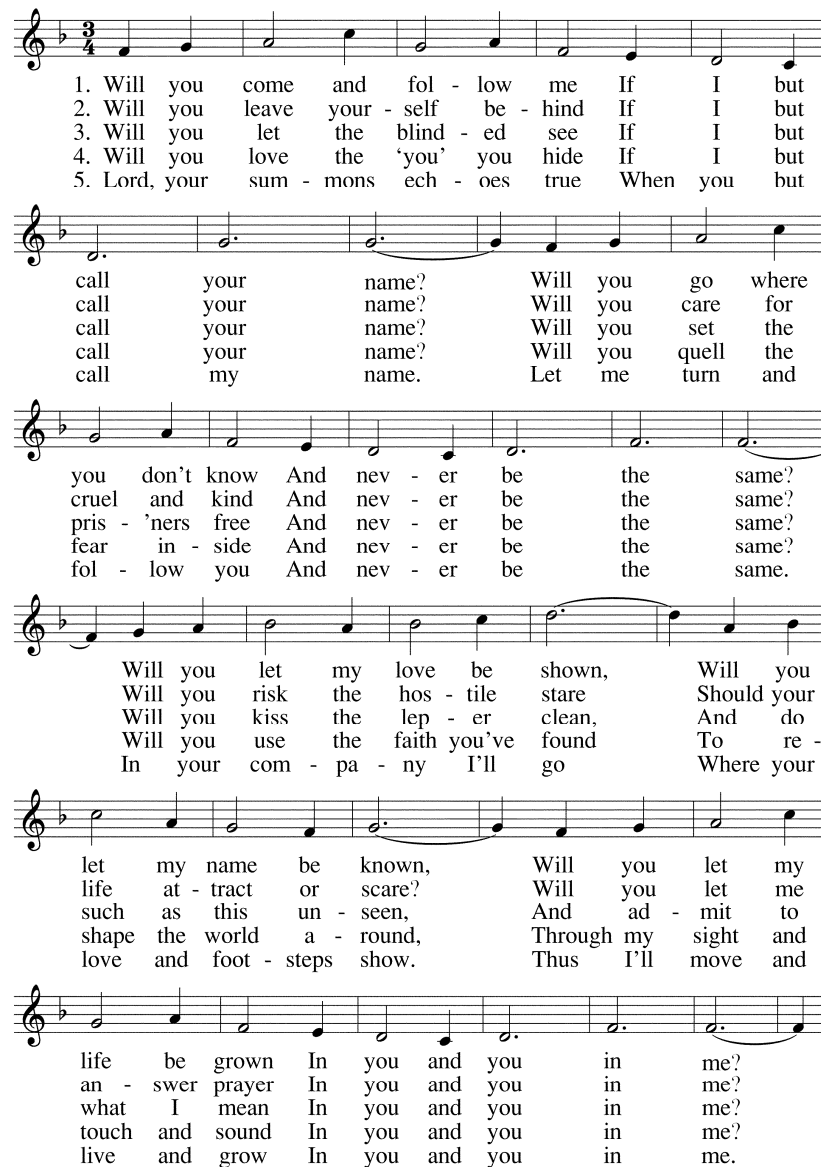
A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK 9:30-37
