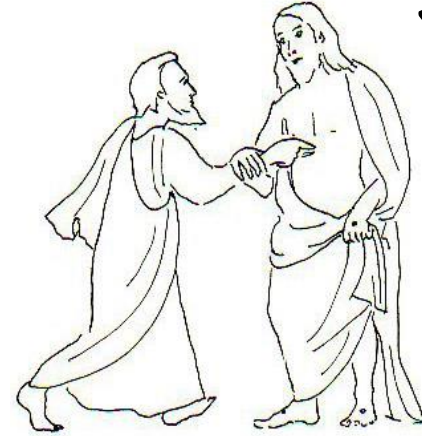

Stewardship reflections : April 28, 2019 - 2nd Sunday of Easter

"Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.'" (John 20:21)

Peace – the first gift of the risen Lord. Just as Jesus sent the apostles out into the world, so too, He sends us. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be grateful and generous. Look for opportunities to share His peace, not only within our local parish boundaries, but outside of them as well. In giving, we receive the peace of Jesus Christ.

We can relate to Thomas...

When we read the stories about Christ's Resurrection, we may have the impression that the first witnesses found it easy to believe. They were influenced by specific actions such as *seeing, touching and eating* with Christ which proved that the Risen One was the same person who was crucified on the cross.

The Gospel of St. Matthew reports that even seeing what others saw, some people still had doubts. Some believed but others did not. All had the same experiences: the enthusiasm of Jesus' preaching, the distress of his death, followed by fear and despair. When St. Luke recounted the faith journey of the women at the gravesite, their understanding that Christ had truly risen came only when they remembered his words. Similarly, with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, their unknown companion explained that, according to the Scriptures, hope was possible. Jesus reminded people to reread the Scriptures and believe what the prophets had foretold.

To summarize, Christ's Resurrection is not just a recorded fact. It is an experience and the object of a journey. Yet, at the same time, the Resurrection could still appear to be impossible, even an illusion. In order to comprehend, the first witnesses had to return to their understanding of the prophecies and scriptures: *Hope is possible and God is faithful*. Then the experiences of the Resurrection: (joy and peace) could be understood.

To some extent, we are all like Thomas. To discover the Risen One, we must focus on ourselves and discover who we are, where we are going, and acknowledge our fears and despairs. We must reacquaint ourselves with the Scriptures and the Bible. In this process of discovery, we come to the realization that Jesus is alive. Yes, it is possible. Jesus fulfills our most profound expectation that our desire for eternal life with God can happen. Our perspective has evolved. We move forward and anticipate our communion with Our Lord and God.
