Preschool: It is so hard to believe that we are halfway through October! This month is flying by! We made it through the first quarter and with everything going on, that is a major accomplishment. We will continue with our pumpkin activities this week! We will also talk about the letter "P". Please work on reviewing the letters a, b and c. We have completed those and we review daily. We talk about things from home that start with those letters. Don't forget Drug safety week next week! We will also have our Halloween party on Friday, the 30th. Kind: I hope everyone had a great three-day weekend! This week my students will be working on letters J and E. I will be sending home the corresponding flashcards for extra practice. We will also continue to work on number order, sight words, and sorting by color and shape. Make sure to continue practicing the Sight Word flashcards at home! Homework for this week will be a little different. Instead of two sheets, 1 for math and 1 for letter recognition, I will assign 1 hard copy of a letter recognition sheet and a math assignment on IXL. 1st/2nd: We're starting second quarter off strong. Second grade will begin working on cursive handwriting this week and we're continuing to work on our math skills and using complete sentences. First grade is working on learning new math facts and skills and new reading strategies. We're also continuing work on our sight words daily. Both classes will begin a writing project for Halloween this week. In addition, we will be reading several Halloween and fall themed stories in class. New reading goals for second quarter will be going home this week as well. Enjoy the short week and be sure to dress warm for the weather. - Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: This week our class will be working on some core tasks that they should have mastered by now. With the end of the quarter being last Friday, the 16th, students should now be able to write complete sentences using capitalization and punctuation. They should also be able to spell a majority of the words that they use correctly. I have discussed the importance of these items with the class and have made them aware that from this point on, they will start getting things counted wrong for words that are

misspelled, incorrect punctuation, and not using proper capitalization. Another item we will be working on is study skills. We will be reviewing several different techniques to help aid with this. One last thing I will be working on with the students is responsibility for their actions. There will be more about this coming home soon. - Mrs. Cooper

**5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>:** 5th and 6th graders will begin "Ideas" in 6-Trait Writing this week. In Science, 5th graders will be getting ready to test over Ch. 16 next Wed. the 28th and 6th grade will also be reviewing Ch. 1 to test next Thurs. the 29th. In Reading, both grades will start their Lit. Circle over "Number the Stars" and will present their first roles to the class on Friday. In Social Studies, students will be finishing up a unit over the Presidential Election and will test next Friday the 30th. 5th grade will have a states and capitals test over #1-50 this Friday the 23rd. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will be going over some important background information this week over WWII and the Holocaust before starting a Lit. Circle over "The Diary of Anne Frank". **5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Math:** Fifth graders are busy looking at the different rules that go with the various operations and using fractions to illustrate fraction operations and equivalencies. Sixth graders are looking at fractions in the context of number lines, the practical uses of average, and identifying factors. Seventh grade is looking at the difference between similar shapes and congruent shapes and demonstrating their skills with compasses and protractors. Eighth grade is revisiting mean, median, range, and mode and unit multipliers. In algebra, students are working with tougher problems involving order of operations and evaluating expressions. **Fifth grade will have a math test on Wednesday. Sixth grade will have a math test on Thursday.**

**7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>:** In grammar, students are still looking at verbs, including identifying predicate adjectives and predicate nouns and subject-verb agreements. Seventh grade will continue on their unit involving weather and climate and will continue specifically this week with the atmosphere. Eighth grade is looking at types of force and the effects of force on motion and calculating net force. In addition to our social studies units, we've also been talking about various topics related to the upcoming election. We have taken a look at some information on the state of Missouri website related to voter registration and rules for mail-in balloting. **7<sup>th</sup> grade dioramas are due Thursday.
