

Open the doors that need to be opened and close the doors that need to be closed.


Please set my feet upon the straight and narrow road that leads to everlasting life.



ST JAMES CHRISTMAS GIFT SERVICE – SUNDAY DECEMBER 11TH 2022 AT 10.30 A.M.

The family-based charities we traditionally support at this time of year (Centre 56, the Women's Refuge and the Action For Children Day Centre,) have respectfully asked if we would again consider replacing gifts of toys with

- Monetary donations that can be converted into gift vouchers for the families to buy the most appropriate treats for their children

WORLD AIDS DAY



What is World AIDS Day?

World AIDS Day takes place on 1st December each year. It's an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV, and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. Founded in 1988, World AIDS Day was the first ever global health day.

Why is World AIDS Day Important?

Over 105,000 people are living with HIV in the UK. Globally, there are an estimated 38 million people who have the virus. Despite the virus only being identified in 1984, more than 35 million people have died of HIV or AIDS related illnesses, making it one of the most destructive pandemics in history.

Today, scientific advances have been made in HIV treatment, there are laws to protect people living with HIV and we understand so much more about the condition. Despite this, each year in the UK over 4,139 people are diagnosed with HIV, people do not know the facts about how to protect themselves and others, and stigma and discrimination remain a reality for many people living with the condition.

World AIDS Day is important because it reminds the public and government that HIV has not gone away – there is still a vital need to raise money, increase awareness, fight prejudice, and improve education.

What can I do on World AIDS Day?

Buy a red ribbon

World AIDS Day is an opportunity to show solidarity with the millions of people living with HIV worldwide. Most people do this by wearing an HIV awareness red ribbon on the day. You can order a red ribbon from our <u>online shop</u>, pick one up at selected branches of <u>MAC Cosmetics</u> in the UK, or add to a donation when shopping at <u>MAC online</u>.
