In the last few years Queensland has started to adopt the direction system, particularly in Brisbane and the Gold Coast, and these signs can be more reliable than the GPS.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Electric vehicles are not a recent inovation having been in production since the late 1800s, but an interesting variation was the hybrid Woods Electric in 1917. It had a 12hp 4 cylinder Continental petrol engine coupled inline to an electric motor generator and a shaft drive without any gearbox. A magnetic clutch located between the petrol and electric motor allowed the car to be powered by the electric motor or both. Claimed speeds were 20mph with one motor and 35mph with both motors.





Fig. 81.—The Woods Dual Power Car May Be Driven Either by Electricity or by Gasoline, Independently or in Conjunction.

With the battery capacity and therefore weight being less than other electric cars at the time, the



weight was made up by the petrol motor and fuel tank in front. An unusual feature was the foot pedal for reverse under the driver and without an auxillary gearbox, the pedal probably reversed the battery polarity to the motor with the magnetic clutch disengaged.

Toyota believes the proposed change to 100% electric vehicles is premature for many reasons and will continue to produce hybrid vehicles. We must remember Toyota is the most successful vehicle manufacturer and politicians should listen.
