He has worked very hard to focus, and as a result his classwork has been completed on time and he has had very little homework. I am very proud of him for his effort. Preschool: I was so proud that everyone remembered their library books last week! What a great start back to the school year! This week we will learn about snowmen and the letter 's'. We will explore shaving cream and some fake snow to see if they are similar or different. Please continue to work on writing your child's name with them. Students who are going into kindergarten will start writing their names on paper with lines, so they get used to it. Remember to wear hats and gloves! This week looks to be warmer, so we plan to get some fresh air! Have a great first full week of January!

Kind: This week we are learning all about penguins! Our vocabulary words this week are barb, coast, colony, equator, webbed, and marine mammal. We will read Penguins by Anne Schreiber, and on Friday we will watch Disney Natures Penguins. We will continue in phonics with /oa/ sound, like in float and road. In math, we will be working on cubes, line segments, counting by 10s, and dimes. As a reminder, we will continue to go outside as long as it is dry and above 32 degrees. Please make sure your student has a coat, hat, and gloves. I hope you all have a great week! - Mrs. Stewart

1st/2nd: Here we are at our first full week after break. We will be learning all about Martin Luther King, Jr. in 1st and 2nd grade this week. We will read several biographies and watch short videos over MLK, Jr. In 1st we will describe the connection between two individuals, events, ideas, and pieces of information in our text. We will also learn to make inferences as we read. In math we will learn how to count tally marks, use a ruler and learn about inches, sort common objects, add two-digit numbers (without regrouping), and continue to work on skip counting. In 2nd grade students will learn about commas in a series and in dates. They will also learn about key facts in the index (bold words, captions), look for bold words in our text, and look for subheadings before we read a page. In math this week we will be adding two-digit numbers with sums greater than 100, ordering 3-digit numbers, identifying gallon, half-gallon, quart, and liter. We will also continue to work on subtracting. This week we will be talking all things weather in science. Please continue to read at home and practice spelling words! Second graders have some tricky words this week. - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: Here we are . . . ready for our first full week back. Our class is jumping right back into our normal routine. Third grade will have a science test on Wednesday and fourth grade will have one on Thursday. Tomorrow, third grade will have a math test and fourth grade will have one on Thursday. We will continue to work on our multiplication facts. So, please practice with your student nightly. Students should also be reading each night for their AR goals.

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th and 6th graders will be looking at figurative language including assonance and alliteration. In Science, 5th grade will read about magnetism and friction and 6th grade will have a quiz over Ch. 1 S. 2 " Properties of Waves" on Friday. In English, both grades will practice comparing with adjectives. In Reading, students will continue working through their Buckledown and C.A.R.S. workbooks. In Social Studies, 5th grade will read about events leading up to the Civil War and 6th grade will read about Spanish conquistadors. Sixth grade will have a U.S. Presidents test over #1-20 on Friday and 5th grade will have a label the United States test next Wed., January 18th.

7/8 Comm. Arts: Students will review setting, tone, and mood and will have a test over these elements on Wednesday. Have a wonderful week! - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: Fifth grade is working on the relationship between metrics and decimals and the relationship between decimals and fractions. In sixth grade, students are working on mixed-number operations and the uses of prime factorization. **7/8:** In social studies, seventh grade is learning about topics related to the Renaissance and Reformation and advancements which improved exploration. In eighth grade, students are learning about the Constitutional Convention and what it can tell us about the operation of our government. In science, seventh grade is continuing their unit on astronomy by learning about the planets. In eighth grade, students are learning about cell parts.
