Both 'regular' 20 minute papers (followed by 10 minutes discussion) and 90 minute workshops are invited.

If you wish to present a paper, indicate it on the enclosed registration form, including a one-paragraph abstract, by 31 May.

Production Schedule for Language and Linguistics in Melanesia

We are pleased to announce that we are progressing well towards bringing LLM up to date. After a number of problems with the large number of special characters needed for volume 17 (for 1986), it is being sent out at the same time as this issue of Hebou. Volume 18 (for 1987) is now being prepared for printing and should be ready to be mailed out by early August. Sufficient papers have been accepted to fill volume 19 (for 1988), so this volume should be out before the end of the year. We appreciate the patience of the membership during this time, and trust you will enjoy the journal as you receive it.
