There will be a spelling test on Friday. The 2nd graders have a review week and will be tested over all of the words. Please quiz your child on their basic math facts. I am glad to see your children's faces today as we finish up this month of November. This week in our class, we will continue to work on learning the parts of speech in Language Arts. We will primarily focus on adverbs. In Science, we will be starting Chapter 4 in both grades. I am going to have the kids start learning how to take notes and develop some much needed study skills. I would like to see more work on Xtra Math in order to get those basic facts learned. I am going to try more devices available for the kids to practice their math facts while here at school as well. Soon we will be moving into multiplication facts but before we can do that, they must know their addition facts.
