The Song of the Vineyard

(Isaiah 5)

- <u>1</u> I will sing to my well-beloved a song of my beloved *concerning* His vineyard: My well-beloved had a vineyard upon a fruitful hill.
 - 2 And He dug it, *cleared out* the stones, and planted it with the choicest vine; and He built a tower in the midst of it, and made a wine-press there. He looked that it should bring forth grapes, but it brought forth wild grapes.
- <u>3</u> And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, judge, I pray you, between Me and My vineyard.
- <u>4</u> What was there yet to do to my vineyard that I have not done in it? Whereby, when I looked that it should bring forth grapes, it brought forth <u>wild grapes</u>?
- <u>6</u> Therefore I will make it a waste -- it shall not be pruned or cultivated......*I will command the clouds not to rain upon it (the blessings of heaven).*
- <u>7</u> For the vineyard of The Lord of hosts is the house of Israel, and the men of Judah the plant of His delight: He looked for justice *and found wickedness instead of righteousness, and distress.*
- <u>8</u> Woe to them who add house to house, and join field to field *(riches upon riches)* until there is no more room, and that you dwell yourselves alone *(with prestige)* in the midst of the land!
 - 9 Their wealth shall become desolate when I act. These great and excellent ones.
 - 12 They live it up with music and are given to much wine in their banquets; they have no regard for the work of Yahweh, or appreciate the work of His hands.

13Therefore *they* are led away captive from lack of knowledge. *They shall perish*.

- 14 Sheol waits for them. Their riches and fame shall descend [into it], and all their joy!
- <u>15</u> The mean man shall be bowed down, and the great man brought low, and the eyes of the lofty shall be brought low
 - 21 Woe to them who are wise in their own eyes, and intelligent in their own esteem.
- 23 They justify *wickedness* for a bribe, and turn away the righteousness of the righteous from them!
- 24 They have rejected the law of The Lord of hosts, and despised the word of the Holy One of Israel.

25Therefore His anger is kindled against them.

16 The Lord of hosts shall be exalted in judgment, and the Holy God hallowed in righteousness. Yes The LORD Almighty will be exalted by his justice, and the Holy God will be proved Holy by his Righteous acts.
