Dear Parishioners helping to spread the Gospel.

In order to keep our spirits up, we need to be aware of the blessing that surround us. Joyce has been taking photographs around our garden and we have been exchanging pictures on WhatsApp with our family members. As we walked around our garden, we noticed the first snowdrop on 13th January and the first crocus on 22nd; neither spectacular enough for a good picture but joyful signs of new life. Vaccinations are being rolled out and all we need now is patience to get through this period. We know what to do to try to keep safe so we don't need to follow all those horrific media stories.

Yet another positive event this month was the dignified ceremony of President Biden's inauguration. We ask for God's guidance to help to heal the wounds of a divided nation.

The Diocesan Service, to be transmitted on the 31st January, was recorded in Ballymascanlan Church. At that service the gospel reading for the service is about healing, which we all need. We look for hope in the psalm appointed for that service:

He alone is my rock and my salvation, my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken. In God is my strength and my glory. God is my strong rock, in him is my refuge. Put your trust in him always, my people, pour your hearts before him, for God is our refuge. Psalm 62: 6 – 8

We will get back to normal but it will be a new normal. Many ways of living will change because instead of drifting along we are forced to consider our choices and possibly change our ways. Since we are all called to serve, we pray:

Remember O Lord, that which thou hast wrought in us and not what we deserve and as thou hast called us to thy service make us worthy of our calling; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


