Pentecost

"The disciples were all filled with the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:4)

The Holy Spirit is the love of God. Within the Trinity, he is the flame of love going from the Father to the Son, and from the Son to the Father. Pentecost was the moment when each of the apostles had the overwhelming experience of being loved by God. Pentecost is the moment when, by the grace of God, you realize that you are specially loved by God as his precious son or daughter. The Holy Spirit wants to fill each of us with experiences of this love, just as he did for the apostles. So, take some time today to visualize God's perfect love. Picture it flowing between the Father and the Son without constraints or roadblocks. Then, ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with this love. Like the apostles, you may be overwhelmed by God's presence in your heart. And that's perfectly fine because it's exactly what the Spirit came to do.

The Paschal mystery of the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus is completed in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father at the request of the Son upon his disciples. St. Peter's apostolic preaching resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian faith that very day. We too can join this celebration by:

- 1. Permitting the Holy Spirit to direct our lives by constantly remembering and appreciating His Holy Presence within us.
- 2. Fortifying ourselves with the help of the Spirit against all types of temptations by seeking the assistance of the Spirit in our thoughts, words, and deeds.
- 3. Listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit speaking to us through the Bible and through the good counsel of others.
- 4. Fervently praying for the gifts, fruits and charisms of the Holy Spirit to renew our lives daily.
- 5. By living our lives in the Holy Spirit, with His help, as lives of commitment, of sacrifice, and of joy.

As we look forward to the end of Covid-19 restrictions this month, we are challenged to examine our sense of compassion, our patience and tolerance. Learning to forgive is a lifelong task, but the Holy Spirit is with us to make us agents of forgiveness. Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life.

Prayer: Come Holy Spirit, make our ears to hear, make our eyes to see, make our mouths to speak, make our hearts to seek, make our hands to reach out and touch the world with your love.

Subject to government Covid regulation changes.


